


CORPUS CHRISTI DISTRICT

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDER WAY:

- Harbor Bridge replacement project. US 181 in Corpus Christi. Total project cost: \$1 billion. Estimated completion date: 2020. (Design/Build)
- SH 358 (SPID) EB ramp reversal Corpus Christi. Estimated completion date: 2022. Project cost: \$50.7 million
- US 77/I 69. Driscoll Relief route, Nueces County. Estimated completion date: 2023. Project cost: \$118 million.
- US 181/SH 35 interchange. San Patricio County. Estimated completion date: 2012. Project cost: \$43 million.

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- US 77/I 69. Upgrade to interstate standards from Kingsville to Riviera, Kleberg County. Estimated project cost: \$95 million. Let date 2023; four years for construction.
- US 77/I 69. Upgrade to interstate standards from FM 1356 to south of Kingsville, Kleberg County. Estimated project cost: \$45 million. Let date 2020.
- US 281 interstate upgrade/relief route, Premont, Jim Wells County. \$72 million. Let date August 2019.

MAINTENANCE: The Corpus Christi district has a regular maintenance budget of \$25 million. The district anticipates spending \$13 million on seal coat projects in FY 2019.

CORRIDORS: Priority corridors include I-69/US 77, I-37, US 59, US 281, US 181, US 183 and SH 72 through the Eagle-Ford shale region.

SAFETY: The district aggressively addresses system safety by providing wider shoulders, adding centerline and edge line rumble strips, adding passing lanes, constructing cable barriers on divided highways and installing traffic signals and illumination at intersections.
