## TxDOT RESPONDS TO THE COVID-19 THREAT

TxDOT is acting to help re-duce the risk of COVID-19 by taking steps to protect the public and employees. At the same time, TxDOT remains committed to delivering essential services to its customers all over the Lone Star State.

Given the recommendation from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to cancel gatherings of 50 or more people and the request from the federal government to avoid gatherings larger than 10 people, TxDOT is postponing or canceling in-person public hearings, meetings and gatherings. The Texas Transportation Commission meeting on March 26 was conducted as a telephonic/audio meeting. When possible TxDOT will look to offer virtual participation strategies for public input.



Work on projects to improve our transportation system continues, as does TxDOT's ongoing work to maintain and operate our state's transportation system.

TxDOT has closed the lobbies of its 12 Travel Information Centers until further notice to help combat the threat of COVID-19. Outside restrooms will remain available at all times and will be regularly cleaned between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The safety rest areas across the state are open, with expedited cleaning around the clock to minimize the spread of the virus. These give much needed rest for truck drivers as they transport medical supplies, food and other essential items to Texans.

Travelers can also still speak with our center counselors about road conditions or travel information between 8 a.m. and

5 p.m. Anyone can call **1-800-452-9292** or visit [drivetexas.org](http://drivetexas.org) to obtain road condition information 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

As awareness is key, TxDOT began sharing safety and informational messages on its digital highway signs throughout the state.

These are short, easy to read messages to help reinforce the importance of preventing the spread of the virus and where people can get credible information.





