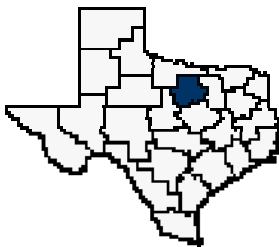




DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- I-635/SH 121 Interchange—\$370 million
- I-30/SH 360 Interchange—\$233 million
- I-820 East Loop—rebuild and widen—\$174 million
- Trinity River Vision—bridges—\$66 million
- US 377 Cresson Relief Route—\$61 million
- SH 360—add mainlanes—\$53 million
- FM 156—add mainlanes—\$49 million
- SH 199—add mainlanes and bridges—\$46 million
- SH 121 Peak-Use Lanes—widen—\$28 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- North Tarrant Express I-35W north of US 81/287—rebuild and widen—\$762 million (2019)
- SH 199 in Lake Worth—add mainlanes—\$315 million (2020-24)
- I-30 Interchange at Spur 580—add mainlanes and reconfigure—\$81 million (2021)
- Southeast Connector—rebuild and widen—\$1.7 billion (2022)

MAINTENANCE: We spend approximately \$120 million annually for preventive, routine and rehabilitative maintenance.

SAFETY: Our current and upcoming safety projects include 72 miles of added shoulders along farm-to-market roads in Erath, Hood, Johnson, Palo Pinto, Tarrant and Wise counties for approximately \$46 million.
