MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- **US 290:** reconstruction and widening from I-610 to FM 2920 — \$2.4 billion
 - Anticipated completion: 2019
- **SH 288 toll lanes in Harris County:** construct 4 toll lanes from US 59 to Harris/Brazoria County line. Comprehensive Development Agreement for \$815 million.
 - Anticipated completion: Summer 2020
- **I-45 South*:** widening from Nasa 1 to FM 518 — \$100 million
 - Anticipated completion: Fall 2021
- **I-45 South:** widening from FM 518 to FM 517 — \$122 million
 - Anticipated completion: Spring 2021
- **I-45 South*:** widening from FM 517 to FM 1764 — \$230 million
 - Anticipated completion: Fall 2022
- **US 59/I-69S:** widening from FM 762 to Spur 10 — \$135 million
 - Anticipated completion: Fall 2019
- **US 59/I-610 West Loop interchange reconstruction*:** reconstruct direct connectors and I-610 main lane bridge - \$259 million
 - Anticipated completion: Late 2023
- **I-10 West*:** widening from FM 359 to Brazos River project cost \$195 million
 - Anticipated completion: Spring 2021
- **SH 99/Grand Parkway Segments H and I:** design-build contract to construct 53 miles of new toll lanes - \$895 million
 - Anticipated completion: Spring 2022
- **SH 249:** design-build contract to construct 26 miles of new toll lanes from FM 1774 in Montgomery County and extends to SH 105 in Grimes County - \$522 million
 - Anticipated completion: Summer 2022
- **I-45 North*:** from downtown to Beltway 8
 - Segment 3 the Downtown Loop System funded = \$2.78 billion
 - Currently in environmental impact statement phase; anticipating clearance in FY 2020

MAINTENANCE: The district spent \$349 million in FY 2019 on preventive and routine maintenance.

CORRIDORS: The district's major thoroughfares include I-610 Loop, I-10, I-45, SH 288, SH 6, SH 225, SH 146, US 59/I-69, US 290, US 90 and Beltway 8.

SAFETY: Safety is priority number one! Over the last four years the Houston District has allocated over \$15 million for highway safety enhancement (HSE) projects.
