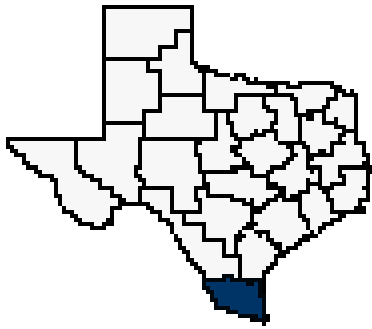




DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- US 83 Veleño Bridge in Zapata County
- US 83 La Joya Phase 1 - \$55 million
- Interstate 2/Bicentennial - \$46 million
- US 77 Willacy County - \$22.7 million
- US 77 Interstate upgrade north of Raymondville - \$40 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- Second access to South Padre Island, environmental clearance in FY 2019 - estimated \$700 million
- Toll 365 - \$162 million (FY 2019)
- SH 68 - \$55 million (FY 2022)
- IBTC - environmental stage - estimated \$145 million
- SL 195 in Starr County, environmental stage, mile relief route - estimated \$168 million
- US 83 La Joya Phase 2 - \$162 million (FY 2019)
- Interstate 2 & Interstate 69C Interchange Design Build - \$322 million (FY 2019)

MAINTENANCE: FY 2018 - Provided \$40 million in preventive maintenance and \$33 million in rehabilitation including SH 186 in Willacy County and US 281 (Military Hwy.) in Cameron County.

CORRIDORS: The Pharr District's priority corridors include expansion and relief route projects on I-69E, I-69C, I-2, US 77, US 281 and US 83.

SAFETY: The Pharr District, in conjunction with the three MPOs of the region, let a Continuous Illumination Project. The \$4 million project restores and upgrades the illumination along the interstate corridors of the district. Plans are also underway through the Routine Maintenance Contract (RMC) for a \$1 million camera installation project. A total of twenty-four cameras will be placed in strategic zones for safety purposes.
