


TEXAS – OKLAHOMA PASSENGER RAIL STUDY

The project will include conducting a feasibility study, developing a Service Level National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) document, and finalizing the Service Development Plan (SDP) for a passenger rail corridor. Preferred service alternatives for passenger rail service along the 850-mile corridor between Oklahoma City and South Texas will be identified. The project will also include identification of the landscape-level environmental effects of the preferred alternatives of the project. The SDP will include a prioritized business plan for development of the corridor at the project level.
