INTRODUCTION

The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization, acting through the City of Longview Planning Department, is responsible for coordinated, comprehensive, and continuing transportation planning in the Longview Metropolitan Area as required by the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity Act, A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). The primary planning document, the Longview Metropolitan Transportation Plan, based on a 1998 base year travel demand model and 2030 projections, was adopted November 18, 2004. The Longview Urban Transportation Study Policy Committee adopted the 2008-2011 TIP on April 30, 2007. The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board adopted revisions to the 2008-2011 TIP on January 29, 2008 to include total project costs and year of expenditure dollars for each project. The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board adopted revisions to the 2008-2011 TIP on July 22, 2008 to make minor changes to the transit projects in all fiscal years. The 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program was revised in 2009 in response to the Economic Stimulus Recovery Plan proposed by Congress and President Obama. Ensuring that the Longview area was prepared to move transportation projects forward once the bill was signed, the TIP was revised to include possible projects. The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board adopted these revisions to the 2008-2011 TIP on February 25, 2009 to include the Economic Stimulus Recovery Plan projects.

A. PURPOSE

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) identifies and schedules transportation projects to be implemented in the Longview Metropolitan Area for the upcoming four fiscal years. In accordance with the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity Act, A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) which was passed on August 10, 2005 and 23 U.S.C. 134(i)(4) and 23 U.S.C. 135(f)(2)(D), the TIP is updated at least every two years. The projects can be implemented and existing transportation facilities maintained with current and expected revenue sources. These projects come from the financially constrained Metropolitan Transportation Plan and are financially constrained at the state level. The TIP includes all transportation projects, including major streets and highways, public transportation, pedestrian walkways, bicycle transportation facilities, and transportation enhancement projects proposed for federal funding. Projects must be consistent with the adopted transportation plan. Regionally significant locally funded projects are included as well.

B. DEFINITION OF PLANNING AREA

The Longview Metropolitan Area includes the City of Longview, the City of White Oak, portions of Gregg County and western Harrison County. (See the attached Longview MPO boundary map on page 9.)

C. PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROCESS

The 2008-2011 TIP and revisions to the TIP in January 2008, July 2008 and February 2009 were developed in accordance with the Public Participation Plan of the Longview MPO. Public comment and ideas were solicited prior to the development of a draft TIP. The following

meetings are scheduled to be held in conjunction with the development of the TIP: The draft TIP was presented at a public meeting on April 19, 2007. A public comment period on the draft TIP extended from April 19, 2007 to April 28, 2007. The Citizens Advisory Committee reviewed the 2008-2011 TIP on April 17, 2007. The MPO Technical Committee reviewed the TIP on April 17, 2007 and on February 25, 2009 and recommended it for approval by the MPO Policy Committee.

The MPO Policy Committee adopted the 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program at a public meeting on April 30, 2007. The MPO Technical Committee reviewed the TIP on January 22, 2008 and recommended it for approval by the Policy Committee. The MPO Policy Committee adopted the revised 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program at a public meeting on January 29, 2008 to include Year of Expenditure and Total Project Cost and also revised on July 22, 2008 to update the funding for the public transportation section of the TIP.

A public meeting was held on February 11, 2009 in the City of Longview Council Chambers to present proposed projects in accordance with the Economic Stimulus Recovery Plan. A ten-day public comment and review period began on February 11 and ended on February 20, 2009. The Policy Board adopted the revisions at a public meeting on February 25, 2009.

D. PROJECT SELECTION PROCESS

Federal and State funded capacity expansions are selected from the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. Projects in the Metropolitan Transportation Plan advance to the ten-year Statewide Mobility Plan, then to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) based on funding availability. Each project is assigned to a specific fiscal year in the TIP, and is expected to be implemented in that year. If for any reason a project cannot be implemented in the assigned fiscal year, a project from the succeeding year may be selected in its place.

E. PROGRESS FROM THE PREVIOUS YEAR

Fiscal year 2006 projects from the 2006-2008 Transportation Improvement Program, which have been completed, are under construction or are expected to go to construction by the end of the fiscal year include:

- Loop 281, from Shofner Dr, north and northeast to U.S. 259, widen from a four to a six lane urban highway with raised medians and improve intersections
- Paul Boorman Trail, from U.S. 80, west of Spur 63, to W. Fairmont St., east of Bill Owens Pkwy, construct a pedestrian & bicycle trail with parking lot.
- Entryway landscaping and signage, landscaping and signs at four entrances to the city, Interstate 20 at Estes Pkwy, Loop 281 and U.S. 259 and Loop 281 at S.H. 31
- Loop 281, from F.M. 1845 to Harrison County Line, overlay pavement
- U.S. 80, from Silver Falls Rd. to U.S. 259, improve traffic signals at 15 various locations
- S.H. 31, from South St. to U.S. 80, interconnect traffic signals

- U.S. 259, from Loop 281 to I-20, improve and interconnect traffic signals
- F.M. 1252, from S.H. 135 to S.H. 31, widen roadway to 28 feet
- I.H. 20, from Smith Co. line to Harrison Co. line, install median barrier
- F.M. 2087, from Loop 281 to F.M. 349, widen roadway to 28 feet
- F.M. 2275, from U.S. 271 to F.M. 3272, widen roadway to 28 feet
- F.M. 2751, from F.M. 449 to F.M. 1844, widen roadway to 28 feet
- U.S. 259, from U.S. 80 to Loop 281, rehabilitate deteriorated pavement
- F.M. 2879, from F.M. 449 to F.M. 2208, widen lanes on existing roadway
- F.M. 2208, from F.M. 449 to F.M. 2879, install safety fixed objects

F. AIR QUALITY ISSUES

Air Quality Status

Currently, the Longview Metropolitan Area is in attainment or in compliance with the National Ambient Air Quality Standard for ozone; however the Longview value has increased steadily by one parts per billion (ppb) per year over the past three years. The preliminary 2004-2006 value of 85 ppb is not in compliance with the 8-hour standard which means that the Longview monitor must have a fourth highest 8-hour ozone of 82 ppb or lower in 2007 to demonstrate compliance with the 8-hour national air quality standard. Compliance with the 8-hour National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) standard for ozone is determined by averaging the three years of the fourth highest 8-hour ozone level at a single monitoring station. The average must be lower than 75 parts per billion to meet the standard.

Northeast Texas Air Care

In 1996, the northeast Texas region's leaders created the Northeast Texas Air Care (NETAC) to address ozone air quality concerns in Gregg, Harrison, Rusk, Smith, and Upshur Counties. NETAC is a voluntary association of governmental agencies, businesses and citizens which promotes clean air in the area through an ozone action program. During 2004, NETAC continued to improve air quality throughout the five county region through implementation of the Early Action Compact. In December 2004, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) formally approved the Early Action Compact (EAC) developed by NETAC, by incorporating NETAC's plan into the State Implementation Plan (SIP). TCEQ's proposed SIP was submitted to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for approval before December 2004 as required by the EAC. In 2004, NETAC completed and submitted an updated emissions inventory report to TCEQ. This updated emissions inventory will be incorporated into EPA's national emissions inventory and can be utilized by NETAC and other interested parties in conducting ozone air quality modeling using the most recent and accurate emissions information. Early Action Compact

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region VI endorsed the TCEQ Protocol for Early Action Compacts (EAC) on June 19, 2002. It establishes a two-step process that offers a more expeditious time line for achieving clean air than expected under EPA's 8-hour standard. The EAC Protocol allows a region to enter into a memorandum of Agreement (MOA), committing to develop and implement a detailed technical plan to reach attainment by 2007. The northeast Texas five county region voluntarily agreed to participate in the EAC Protocol Process, and on

December 20, 2002 signed the Early Action Compact (EAC) for Northeast Texas. The purpose of the EAC is to develop and implement a Clean Air Action Plan that will reduce ground level ozone concentrations throughout the five county area to comply with the 8-hour ozone standard by December 31, 2007 and maintain the standard beyond that date. The Early Action Compact sets measurable, enforceable milestones for developing and implementing the Clean Air Action Plan. If any of the terms and milestones of the Early Action Compact are not met, the EAC will be void and the area will be designated according to the EPA's 8-hour ozone implementation guidelines.

Clean Air Action Plan

The Clean Air Action Plan (CAAP) is the region's official air quality improvement plan with quantified emission reduction measures. The CAAP includes all necessary elements of a comprehensive air quality plan, but will be tailored to local needs and driven by local decisions. The CAAP will be incorporated into the formal State Implementation Plan (SIP) and the region will be legally required to carry out this plan just as in nonattainment areas.

Transportation Conformity

Should the northeast Texas region be designated as nonattainment, highway widening projects would be subject to the Transportation Conformity determination rule. This rule stipulates that the Metropolitan Planning Organization is responsible for proving that the mobile source emissions from future widening projects would not increase the allowable estimated on-road mobile source emissions listed in the State Implementation Plan (SIP). Areas designated at nonattainment are required to demonstrate model-based transportation conformity at least every four years. Failure to meet these requirements can have grave consequences, such as withdrawal of federal funds for highway widening projects. Should nonattainment designation occur, it would have a profound impact on the widening projects contained in this programming document. The East Texas Council of Governments (ETCOG) functions in an administrative role for the North East Texas Air Care activities. ETCOG receives Air Quality Assessment and Planning funds from Rider 8, which are appropriated by the Texas Legislature. The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization, in conjunction with the Texas Department of Transportation have the responsibility of demonstrating transportation conformity, should the area be designated as nonattainment of air quality standards.

G. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)

Longview Transit buses are wheelchair accessible in compliance with the ADA Act. Curb to curb paratransit service is offered to citizens with health problems and to the citizens aged 60 and older. Future highway projects will be constructed according to the ADA Act with handicapped ramps.

H. ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 2000d-1) states that "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity

receiving Federal financial assistance.” President Clinton’s Executive Order on Environmental Justice in 1999 further amplifies Title VI by providing that “each federal agency shall make achieving environmental justice part of its mission by identifying, as appropriate, disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects of its programs, policies, and activities on minority populations and low-income populations.” MPO staff, in several ways, accomplished compliance with Environmental Justice. When advertising for the public meetings to present the 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program, public notices and newspaper advertisements were placed in the local Longview News Journal and a free community newspaper, the East Texas Review. MPO staff produced two maps identifying the projects in the 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program overlaid on a map showing income and ethnic group dispersion by traffic analysis zone. Income data and ethnic information was obtained from the 2000 Census. The maps illustrated where these groups are geographically located in relationship to the projects in the 2008-2011 TIP. The Technical Committee reviewed the income and ethnic/race maps and found compliance with the principles of Environmental Justice relating to transportation planning are satisfied.

I. TOTAL PROJECT COST AND YEAR OF EXPENDITURE DOLLARS

In accordance with the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient, Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) which was passed on August 10, 2005, the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) contains the Total Project Costs and Year of Expenditure dollars for each project. The Year of Expenditure, or simply stated, the year in which construction or a transit project is anticipated, has been identified for each of the projects. An annual inflation rate of 4% was applied to all projects. The Total Project Costs are provided to detail the parts of each project such as: preliminary engineering, right of way, utility relocation and in the case of transit projects: operating, planning, maintenance and capital. The Total Project Cost and Year of Expenditure provide the public with a complete description of the components which make up each of the projects. The revenues and expenditures address the construction or implementation of transportation projects while also addressing the operation and maintenance needs. The expenditures for the Transportation Improvement Program are financially constrained by the Year of Expenditure requirements of SAFETEA-LU. This financial constraint is based on an analysis of past funding, expected funding and expected needs. For incoming federal, state and local sources of revenues used to estimate total future revenues, a Rate of Growth of 4% per year was utilized for all projects and is consistent with a 4% annual inflation rate. The Rate of Growth was based on consultations with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). Projects in this document are reasonably expected to be funded by federal, state and local sources. The planning staff must account for cost escalation as part of the fiscal constraint determination. With respect to the public transportation or transit program, current funding apportionments, which have stayed relatively the same during the previous five years, are not increasing enough to cover the ever-increasing rate of inflation. Strategies to address the funding gaps might be to reduce service hours and routes, to reduce the rate at which buses are replaced or to generate additional revenue through advertising, fare increases, explore other revenue generation methods or increase local funding to the transit program.

J. MPO AND TRANSIT AGENCY COORDINATION

The Longview MPO and the administrative personnel of Longview Transit regularly meet to discuss transportation issues and updates. Consultation and coordination activities are an ongoing process. The operating, capital and maintenance costs for TIP inclusion are discussed and reviewed by the MPO and Longview Transit staff. The manager of Longview Transit is a member of the MPO Technical Committee and the Longview MPO Director is a member of the Longview Transit Advisory Committee.

The East Texas Transportation Planning Steering Committee was formed in June 2005 as the vehicle for implementing the goals of Chapter 461 of HB 3588. Following its creation, the Steering Committee identified its mission “to create and connect a comprehensive, flexible, and sustainable public transportation service throughout and beyond the 14 counties of State Planning Region 6,” hereafter referred to as East Texas. The purpose of the plan is to identify the needs of health and human service agencies, public and private transportation providers, and the public so that the utilization of available resources is as efficient as possible. The Plan is also intended to identify a set of concrete actions and projects that will fulfill the mission of the Steering Committee by creating a framework to implement the six priorities officially adopted by the Steering Committee. The need for coordination among the numerous health and human service agencies and public and private transportation providers in East Texas is derived from the varied needs of the people they serve. The public and stakeholder involvement undertaken in association with the preparation of the Transportation Coordination Plan has identified numerous areas of need related to the provision of public transportation in East Texas. The Longview Metropolitan Planning Organization’s Director and the Manager of Longview Transit are members and have been regular participants of the Steering Committee.

Other regional coordination efforts are reflected in the recent maintenance agreement with Longview Transit and East Texas Council of Governments. The agreement allows Longview Transit to perform routine maintenance services for the fleet of East Texas Rural Transit.

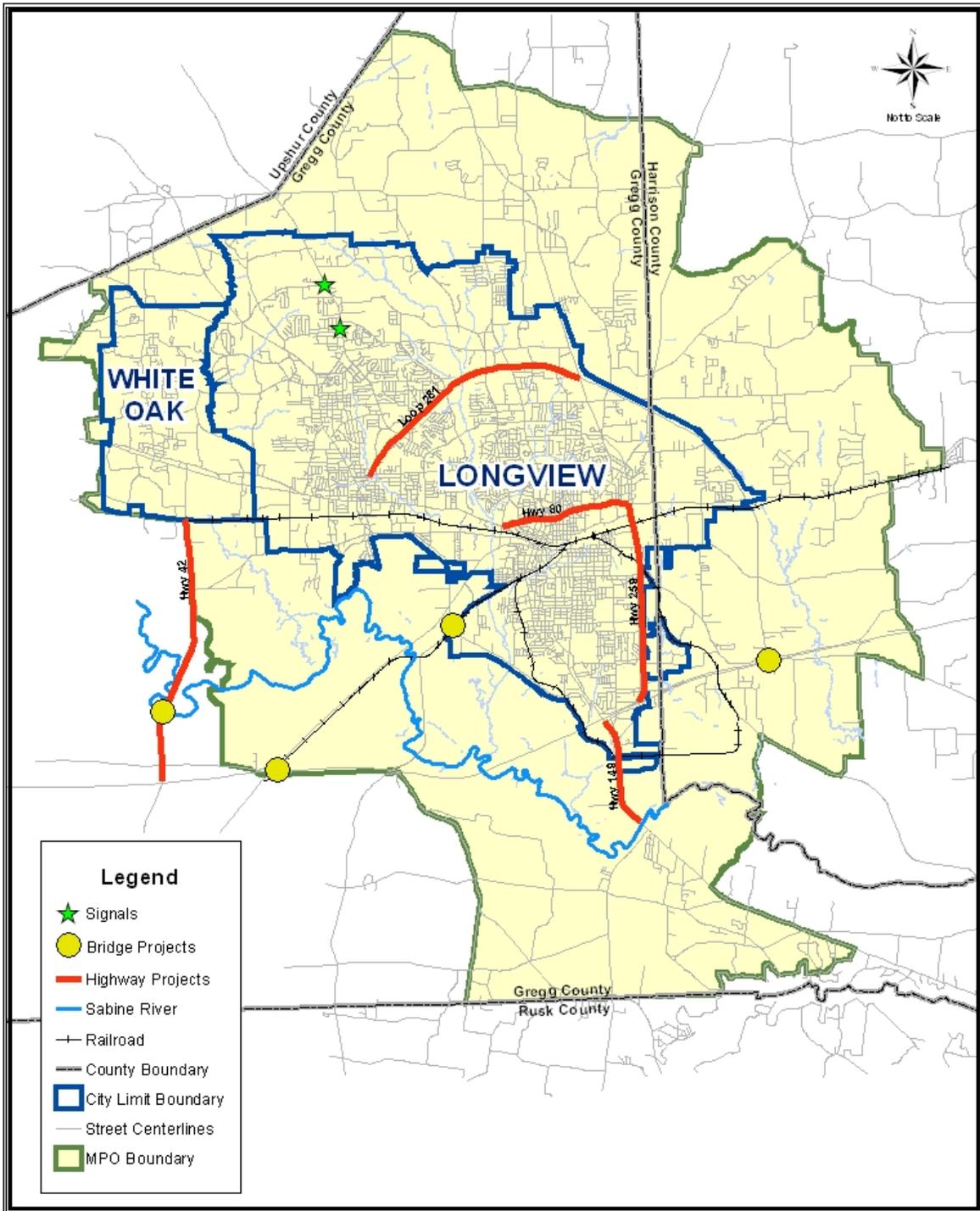
