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
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What We Heard


The first series of public meetings, which were held in eight locations along the corridor, had over 170 people in attendance. Citizens, public officials and elected officials came to learn about the study and provide input on future corridor planning. Of those providing written comments, 89% believed that some type of transportation

improvements are needed in the corridor. The improvements identified by most respondents were to widen existing roadways from two to four lanes, followed by building relief routes, and upgrading the corridor to interstate standards. All of these improvements were included in the development of the initial alternatives. The second, and final, series of public meetings will review the initial alternatives, the evaluation process, and results of the transportation improvement alternatives evaluation.

WHAT ARE THE OBJECTIVES OF THIS STUDY?

- **Determine existing and future mobility and safety needs**
- **Evaluate impacts and feasibility of alternative transportation improvements**
- **Assess advantages of improved connections to military installations and deployment ports**
- **Develop a prioritized implementation plan**
- **Identify alternative funding sources**
- **Obtain public/stakeholder input**



INITIAL ALTERNATIVES

All initial alternatives were developed based on the concept of upgrading the corridor to a freeway (interstate), four-lane highway, or combinations of both. The results of this initial evaluation included removing some alternatives from further consideration and determined the alternatives that should be considered for detailed evaluation. The results of the initial screening and preliminary conclusions of the detailed evaluation will be presented at the upcoming public meetings. The study will also identify interim/localized improvements such as overpasses, relief routes, truck passing lanes, and other operational/geometric improvements. The public is encouraged to attend this final series of public meetings to provide feedback on the study findings to date, assist in identifying potential interim/local improvements, and any additional information to aid in the corridor development.
