NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will conduct a public meeting on Thursday, May 12, 2016, to present the proposed roadway improvements for FM 2493 in Smith and Cherokee Counties. The meeting will be held from 5 - 7 p.m. at Bullard High School Cafeteria located at 1426 S. Houston Street in Bullard. It will be in an open house “come and go” format with no formal presentation.

The purpose of the meeting is to gather public input on the proposed improvements. This project’s limits are from FM 346 in Flint to US 69 in Bullard in Bullard. The proposed work includes widening the existing two lane pavement structure to four lanes with a flush median. This project will require new right-of-way from adjacent property owners.

Exhibits showing aerial photography of the proposed project will be presented at the meeting. Representatives from TxDOT will be available to answer individual questions. The preferred alternative will be available for review online at <http://www.txdot.gov/inside-txdot/projects/studies/tyler/fm-2493.html> or at the TxDOT Tyler District Office, 2709 W. Front Street, Tyler. TxDOT offices are open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

All interested parties are invited to attend this meeting to gather information and provide feedback. Every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate those needs.
