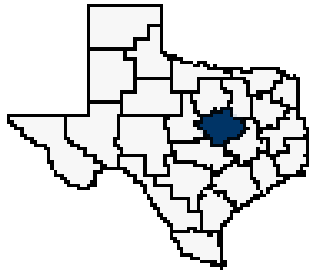




## DISTRICT PROFILE

The Waco District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in its eight counties. The district primarily conducts asset preservation and mobility projects to ensure the safety of the traveling public. The Waco district experiences a wide variety of challenges for maintenance crews and designers in maintaining district assets and ensuring the safety of the traveling public year-round.

### MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- I-35 widening – Bell/Falls/McLennan - 26 miles - \$810 million
- US 190 - Greater Fort Hood area - (Bell County) - widen to three lanes in each direction - \$66 million
- SH 31 – (Hill County) - widening and new location from CR 3344 to Navarro County Line - \$72 million

### PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- I-35E widening from Ellis County Line to I-35W split - \$100 million
- US 190 – FM 3423 to FM 2410 - widen to three lanes in each direction - \$43 million
- I-35 reconstruction from N Loop 340 to 12<sup>th</sup> Street (6 miles) in Waco - \$300 million

**MAINTENANCE:** Approximately \$23 million annually on sealcoat and overlay projects plus an additional \$7 million to \$8 million on base repair projects.

**\*CORRIDORS:** District priority corridor effort: I-35 from just north of the E/W split in Hill County to the Bell/Williamson County Line. I-35E widening from Ellis County Line, south, to the E/W split. Other priority corridors include US 190, now a federally designated high priority corridor and redesignated as I-14, in western Bell County.

**\*SAFETY:** Our upcoming safety projects include more than \$3 million on striping, texturing and raised pavement markers.
