PROJECT DETAILS

- *District/County:* Abilene District/Taylor & Callahan Counties
- *Highway/Approximate Study Limits:* I-20 from SH 351 to near Buck Creek Road / CR 108
- *Length:* Approximately 6.5 miles
- *Current approved funds for potential construction:* \$40M

ANTICIPATED TIMELINE (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

- *Environmental Study and Schematic Design:* Spring 2019 to Fall 2020
- *Final Design:* Fall 2020 to Fall 2021
- *Construction:* 2023 to 2025

Advancement from phase to phase is contingent upon the outcome of the previous phase and the availability of funding.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The I-20 East Six-Lane Widening Project will identify future safety and mobility improvements to the I-20 corridor in both Taylor and Callahan Counties from SH 351 to near Buck Creek Road / CR 108. TxDOT currently has funds to widen I-20 from SH 351 to the Taylor/Callahan County line. TxDOT aims to identify additional long-term safety and mobility solutions and this effort will include multiple opportunities for public involvement.

WHAT IS THE PROBLEM WE ARE TRYING TO SOLVE?

- Increasing traffic volumes on I-20, including both local traffic and heavy truck traffic, impacting safety and mobility
- An aging facility in need of upgrades (e.g., ramp configurations)
- Need for improved emergency response times
