


## WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU

### About the Study

The goal of the Fredericksburg Relief Route Study is to identify a locally preferred option driven by community input. The Study, which was initiated in early 2018, is being led by the Gillespie County Relief Route Task Force. To date, two public workshops have been held (May 2018 and September 2018). Suggestions and input received during the May 2018 workshop were used by the project team to develop "conceptual route options." The conceptual route options were presented for public review and comment at the September 2018 workshop. Using the input and feedback received at the second workshop, over the last few months the study team has worked to refine the routes and reduce the number of options being considered. That effort has led to the identification of the eight "preliminary route options" that will be presented at the January 24th workshop for review and comment.
