The gentleman prior to me voiced some concerns about lack of access -- being able to access the property, so I, too, would like to know if there's going to be some ability to cut into property without having to go a mile or more down the road to do a turnaround. It also significantly impacts future use of the land, which I think is not a good thing, and suspect the appraisers won't take that into consideration.	No access to property is cut-off. Access will be maintained as-is through construction of the new bridge and u-turn. The existing median openings at Colorado Circle and River Oaks are being removed, so eastbound SH 71 traffic accessing Colorado Circle will use the u-turn at FM 1209 to return on the westbound frontage road.
				Also, since it seems to be about getting Houston people to Austin faster, I want to know if rapid transport was considered. Why build a road? Why not do a rapid transport thing and just avoid this whole mess? I haven't seen anything in the press about rapid transport being considered; although, of course, we've talked about that in this region for the last 20 years or longer. Cedar Creek golf headed to regional meet

Cedar Creek 1 boys finished second at the District 18-5A tournament at Delaware Springs Golf Course in Burnet on April 1-2, qualifying for regionals for the first time since 2016.

Senior Arturo Hernandez, who plays left handed, led the way with a 77-76=153 on the par-72 course.

Hernandez, who has

signed with Division III Arcadia University in Philadelphia, Pa., tied for third place with Georgetown's Coby Koenig.

Cedar Creek finished with 338-324=662 for its two-day total. The Eagles improved 14 strokes on day two.

"The boys got off to a fast start," Cedar Creek coach Jose Martinez said about the second round. "We had three birdies and two pars on the first hole."

Also scoring for Cedar Creek were Braden Murphy, 86-80=166, Marco Espinal, 86-81=167; and Tristan King, 89-87=176.

Kyle Morris shot 98 on the second round after being disqualified in the first round.

Georgetown claimed the team title with 307-304=611, winning by 51 strokes. Georgetown's Haven McEntire captured the individual title with 75-75=150.

Bastrop 1 finished

in fourth place with 354-350=704.

Georgetown 2 was third in 356-342=698.

Bastrop sophomore Zach McClanahan shot 82-80=162 to qualify for regionals as the second individual. Elgin's Evan Joseph was the top individual at 78-80=158.

Also scoring for Bastrop were William Kirk, 88-79=167; Brandon Watley, 85-88=173; and Austin Grinnell, 100-103=203. Kirk, a junior,

improved nine strokes on his second round. Also competing for Bastrop was Joey Estrada at 99-108=207.

"I am very proud of these boys," Bastrop coach Romonda Watley said. "I am super excited about having (McClanahan) the next two years. He will turn some heads..."

Bastrop 2 shot 413-422=835. The team consisted of Josh Eskew, 92-97=189; Caden McNeil, 103-100=203;

Michael Detrixhe 1102=217; and Lul Williams, 103-123=226.

Cedar Creek 2 had total of 427-462=889. Team members were Bryson Murphy 10106=209; Nichol Villarreal, 94-116=210; Alex Fahrenthold, 11106=216; Luke Kadu 120-134=254; and Camd Fester, 139-142=281.

Bastrop nets a pair of bronze medals

Bastrop's Zach Christiansen and Noah Garcia had the best finish among the two local schools at the District 18-5A tennis tournament at East View High School on April 2-3. Christiansen and Garcia downed East View's Knightstep and Bowman 6-3, 6-1 for third place in the boys doubles event. The top two individuals and doubles team from

district advanced to the Region III tournament at Willis High School on April 17-18. Christiansen and Garcia, No. 2 seeds, lost their semifinal match to Georgetown's John Solon and Luke Scott in a third-set tiebreaker 7-6 (8-6), 2-6, 7-4. "The boys knew they had to likely win the semifinal to get to regional," Bastrop coach Robert Ardis said. "Unfortunately, they were not as sharp as they

usually are. Although not at their best, it was still a close match, and they had several chances to put it away. (They) just couldn't close it out." Christiansen and Garcia, both seniors, double bageled Hutto's Martin and Gonzales in the quarterfinals 6-0, 6-0. In mixed doubles, Bastrop's Lauren Talkmitt and Cesar Fuentes, No. 4 seeds, fell in the third-place match to Georgetown's Michael



El Condado Travis lanza campaña para educar a la comunidad sobre la importancia de ser contabilizados el próximo año

A un año de realizarse un nuevo censo demográfico en el país, las autoridades del Condado Travis y activistas locales buscan educar a la comunidad sobre la importancia de que todos seamos incluidos en estas vitales estadísticas.

Sin embargo, los resultados reales del Censo 2020 están en riesgo dado la insistencia de la Administración Trump de incluir la pregunta sobre ciudadanía estadounidense en el cuestionario, algo que preocupa a los activistas y a las autoridades encargadas del censo.

A esta inquietud se debe añadir que los datos no fidedignos del Censo 2020 afectarán directamente la designación de fondos federales para Texas y no reflejará con veracidad los notorios cambios demográficos del Estado.

"El Censo 2020 podría incluir una pregunta adicional sobre ciudadanía que los funcionarios del US Census Bureau consideran un potencial factor de reducción de la participación de la población, en particular de los naturalizados y de los inmigrantes indocumentados. Esa pregunta no se hace desde 1950. La decisión final la dará la Corte Suprema", comenta para EL MUNDO NEWSPAPER Ryan Robinson, demógrafo del Planning and Zoning Department de la Ciudad de Austin.

La US Census Bureau sugirió cambios en las preguntas del formulario del 2020, entre ellas, la del matrimonio entre personas del mismo género ya que, según diversos estudios, estas parejas

no están siendo contabilizadas. Igualmente, habrá cambios en las preguntas sobre la raza de los encuestados, ya sea que se les pedirá detallar a 'negros' y 'blancos' su nacionalidad.

Entre marzo y julio del 2020, la población podrá responder en línea, por teléfono o por correo postal. "La gente empezará a recibir el cuestionario, por correo, desde marzo. Quienes no envíen sus respuestas hasta la fecha límite de cierre, que es en julio, recibirán la visita de trabajadores del US Census Bureau en sus casas", dice Robinson.

El Censo se realiza cada diez años mediante un cuestionario de diez preguntas (el 2020 podrían ser once preguntas); y de acuerdo a los resultados se asignan los asientos de la Cámara de Representantes; se destinan más de 800 millones de dólares anuales en fondos federales para gastos cruciales como la construcción y manutención de escuelas, hospitales, infraestructura de transporte y departamentos de policía y de bomberos, entre otros programas para bienestar de las familias y de sus comunidades.

La comunidad latina: el gran reto

Si las personas no se contabilizan, la comunidad en la que viven podría perder fondos significativos para programas como Medicaid, Medicare, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), afectando programas de vivienda asequible, los almuerzos escolares, la asistencia para la educación especial, así como la planificación y construcción de carreteras.

"Un censo total es siempre un desafío logístico, ya que es difícil captar a los niños pequeños, a los inmigrantes, a las personas que viven en áreas rurales, a las personas de color, a los estudiantes universitarios (que no saben si están incluidos en casa de sus padres o en sus viviendas actuales), a los que se mudan de residencia con frecuencia, a las personas sin hogar y a las personas que enfrentan barreras del idioma", explica Robinson, pero destaca que el US Census Bureau contrató personal bilingüe a políglota para lograr la comunicación con el mayor número de inmigrantes posibles. "Queremos que los inmigrantes se sientan cómodos contestando las preguntas en sus idiomas nativos y que estén seguros que su información no será compartida con ninguna otra entidad federal", concluye Robinson.

El próximo año, las autoridades locales unirán fuerzas con el recién formado Austin-Travis County Complete Court Committee para conciliar sobre la importancia del Censo con el objetivo de lograr la participación de la mayor cantidad de personas posible.

4 I've got a one-year-old that'll follow the same cycle if I even
5 stay around here. I take my daughter to and from school at the
6 high school every day. It's very simple. I exit, go to the
7 high school, come back, turn, cross the median, and right into
8 my driveway.

9 Based on the way it is now, I will have to drive
10 an extra 5 miles every time I take my daughter to school. I
11 pick her up once a day. I drop her off once a day. I also
12 head into Austin a few times each week.

13 So at a simple 15 times a week, having to make
14 this new turnaround, going to 1209, turning around, coming back
15 this frontage road, I'm looking at spending an extra \$2,262 a
16 year in lost gas, transportation costs on that, and that's
17 just, you know, a simple 15. I'm sure there's plenty of my,
18 you know, local residents near me that have to drive that as
19 many times or often.

20 Have you impacted that on the people? Have you
21 told us what -- the extra cost of us driving, just the simple
22 things that we do every day? To me, it looks like this design
23 was either a set of overzealous engineers, who just like to put
24 a lot of things on paper and it looks really good, or there's
25 some potential corruption behind it.

1 Removing all those homes and businesses on the
2 west side of 1209, there's no need in it. You can narrow the
3 median. You can keep the frontage roads if you really want to
4 and those businesses. Wiping those businesses out sounds like
5 some kind of plan to eventually acquire those lands for other
6 people who are looking to build strip malls or a bunch of other
7 things.

8 I don't think we're interested in that in our
9 little area in Wyldwood. We got a light up there because we
10 needed it to get back and forth at one time. 1209's not that
11 important of a road. People use it to get to and from their
12 houses. They get to the school. They use it as a quick cutoff
13 to 1209. It's a local road.

14 We don't need to wipe out our entire local

WHY IMPROVEMENTS ARE NEEDED

State Highway (SH) 71 serves as a major corridor for motorists traveling to and from the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport, the city of Bastrop, and other central Texas communities. In fact, in 2015, the average daily traffic on SH 71 in Bastrop County exceeded 35,000 vehicles a day. With continued growth in eastern Travis and Bastrop counties, TxDOT is planning for improvements on this section of SH 71 to enhance safety and manage congestion.

PURPOSE AND NEED

The proposed project is needed to address increased congestion along SH 71 due to increased population growth and traffic volumes. The purpose of the proposed project is to address increased congestion along SH 71 from CR 206 to SH 21.


PROJECT OVERVIEW


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


SH 71 FROM CR 206 TO SH 21 TYPICAL SECTIONS



EXISTING TYPICAL SECTION SH 71




PROPOSED TYPICAL SECTION SH 71



TxDOT delays construction of Texas 71 frontage roads over Colorado River in Bastrop

The Texas Department of Transportation's \$48 million plan to add frontage road bridges over the Colorado River in Bastrop has hit a delay.

The project, which was expected to be bid out to contractors this month, has been pushed back two months due to "design changes to ensure the agency gets the most valuable low bid," a TxDOT spokesperson said.

The transportation agency now says the project will be bid out in May, with construction beginning in summer. It will take about three years to complete.

The project is being broken down into six different subprojects. The costliest, at \$24 million, will construct two new two-lane frontage road bridges over the Colorado River. Another \$13 million subproject will convert the existing two-way, two-lane frontage roads on College Street into two-lane, one-way frontage roads. The transportation agency will also replace and rehabilitate the frontage road bridges over Gills Branch, less than a half-mile east of the Colorado River.

During certain construction projects, TxDOT will close the Lovers Lane connection to College Street, which is what many Tahitian Village residents use to access the highway. The closure will allow for the concrete pours and beam sets of the new Texas 71 frontage road overpass to be completed. During that time, local traffic will be redirected to exit and enter the Tahitian Village subdivision through the Tahitian Drive and Loop 150 exit on Texas 71. The agency has not said when these detours will take place.

“These detours are designed to occur during off peak nighttime hours and will be coordinated with local officials, emergency services and the school district,” said TxDOT spokesman Brad Wheelis. “We will give a minimum of seven days advanced notice for local users to adjust their nighttime routes.”

No traffic from Texas 71 will be detoured through the Tahitian Village subdivision at any point during construction. And though the project will also rehabilitate the highway’s overpass bridge crossing the Colorado River, two lanes of traffic in both directions will remain open throughout construction.

The frontage road project is part of TxDOT’s larger goal of creating a seamless route between Austin and Houston. The agency still has five stoplights interrupting Texas 71 between Austin and Bastrop, and many of those are in its crosshairs.

TxDOT has allocated \$48 million to build overpasses at Ross Road and Kellam Road in Del Valle — work is set to begin as soon as this fall and be done by summer 2021. Another \$52.6 million has been earmarked for overpasses at Tucker Hill Lane and Pope Bend Road near Cedar Creek, a two-year project tentatively expected to begin in 2020.

That would leave the stoplight at FM 1209, about five miles west of Bastrop, as the sole stoplight along Texas 71 between Austin and Bastrop without an overpass. The agency estimates that an overpass over FM 1209 would cost \$35 million.

BASTROP, Texas (FOX 7 Austin) - The Texas Department of Transportation has put together a [proposal](#) for construction along SH 71 and FM 1209 and it includes displacing dozens of businesses and residents.

The plan is to remove all the stop lights along SH 71 between the Austin airport and Bastrop. It is still subject to change, but 25 business owners and seven homeowners so far have been told they could lose some or all of their property because of the project.

"I think this is going to be a good project for the community because it will be a lot safer around here," said Jafaar Johnson, owner of Johnson's Pet and Kennel Supplies on SH 71 in Bastrop County.

Johnson opened his business just eight months ago and he's already been told to consider moving the location.

"I do know that this building will be gone sometime within the next 3-4 years," said Johnson. Johnson's store sits just west of the FM 1209 intersection and is one of about 25 businesses and seven homes that will likely be impacted by a planned construction project to widen the highway, add frontage roads and build an overpass over FM 1209.

"We don't want to acquire additional right of way if we don't have to," said TxDOT spokesman Brad Wheelis. "Number one, it's an expense for the state. Number two, we don't want to displace folks."

Johnson said some people in the area have lived there for decades.

"Some of these people, not even so much the businesses, but the residents, have been here 30 years. It's sad to see," Johnson said.

The current \$36 million proposal would cut across about six feet of Johnson's building.

"This is a nice sized lot, so I can move back and build a new building," said Johnson. "So I'm happy about that. As long as everything works out in that manner, I'll be okay."

TxDOT has already met with people that will likely be affected, but appraisals and negotiations have yet to happen. Some people will also qualify for relocation assistance. Either way, TxDOT said the project is necessary.

"The SH 71 east corridor is growing," Wheelis said. "From the airport to Bastrop, we're seeing more businesses and homes go up in that area and, therefore, more traffic."

By removing five traffic lights and replacing intersections with overpasses, TxDOT hopes to cut down on crashes in the area as well.

"Within the last month, there's probably been two wrecks, and in the eight months I've been here, I've seen the traffic get further and further back," said Johnson. "The red lights are becoming an issue, I'd say."

While affected business owners said they aren't sure how to feel about the changes until they know some more details, they are happy to see some major improvements on the horizon for SH 71.

"It'll be a straight shot from Austin to Houston. That'll be a good thing," Johnson said.

There is another public hearing on the proposal April 30 at 5:30 p.m. at the Bastrop Convention Center.

Construction is expected to begin in the summer of 2023 with a planned completion date of late 2024.

BEDC: Zoho Corp's move shows Texas 71 corridor a 'proven place' to do business

When Zoho Corp. announced earlier this month that it was moving its headquarters to a campus along Texas 71 in eastern Travis County, fortune smiled on Bastrop.

Economic development experts have forecast that the Texas 71 corridor between Austin and Bastrop will be the next land of opportunity for business, and when Zoho Corp. decided to relocate to the 375-acre property along the highway, the forecasts were confirmed, said Bastrop Economic Development Corporation director Mike Kamerlander.

"We're positioning Bastrop as the next corridor of growth for Austin," Kamerlander said. "Zoho Corp's location on Highway 71 towards Bastrop is a really good indicator that that (projection) is accurate."

The California-based software company has plans to build a 100,000-square-foot building near the intersection of Kellam Road and Texas 71, about 5 miles east of Austin-Bergstrom International Airport and about three miles west of the Bastrop County line.

The building, which is expected to open in 2021, will eventually house 500 employees hired over the next several years. Some of those employees, Kamerlander said, are expected to find housing in Bastrop and Bastrop County rather than face Austin's higher housing prices.

Founded in India in 1996 by CEO Sridhar Vembu, the business software company offers email, analytics, accounting and IT management and other business services. It employs more than 7,000 workers in 12 offices across the globe, including in India, China, Japan and Mexico.

Kamerlander said that he expects the move to spur a "clustering" effect in the area, which could spark other companies to locate in the corridor into Bastrop County and the city of Bastrop.

“Other companies like them, or other companies that support Zoho’s operations look to this and say, ‘Zoho said it works for them, we know it’s going to work for us too,’” Kamerlander said. “That leads to clustering and it gets us over the hurdle of trying to market our location as a good place to do business. ... We can point to this as a proven place to do business.”

The Zoho Corp. campus is not the only major development project slated for the Bastrop-Travis County area. Velocity Crossing was approved by the Austin City Council in 2016 to be built near the Texas 130 and Texas 71 intersection and will feature about 4.5 million square feet of retail, restaurant, office and apartment space. It will be a welcome addition to the growing populations along the stretch of Texas 71 between Austin and Bastrop, which has long been considered a food and amenity desert since subdivisions began cropping up in the area. H-E-B, for instance, has secured 17.2 acres of the property.

The Texas Department of Transportation’s ongoing improvements on Texas 71 will also make the region more attractive to developers and businesses for its ease of access to the airport, Interstate 35 and downtown Austin.

The transportation department already has a \$48 million plan to build overpasses at Kellam Road, where the Zoho project will be located, and Ross Road. Construction is set to begin as soon as this fall and be completed by summer 2021.

Another \$35 million project will create an overpass bridge on Texas 71 at FM 1209 in Wyldwood and will be the final project that will accomplish TxDOT’s ultimate goal of eliminating all stoplights along Texas 71 between Austin and Bastrop.

“We have the land availability from Austin to Bastrop along 71, and then even off FM 969, that allows for these larger corporate campuses to locate, not only from available greenfield space but also an affordability aspect too,” Kamerlander said. “There’s very few other places in the Austin region where you can buy 335 acres like Zoho did at an affordable rate.”

Bye, stoplights! More overpasses coming to Austin-Houston commute

CEDAR CREEK, Texas (KXAN) — As Central Texas keeps growing, traffic is not going to get any easier.

The Texas Department of Transportation is working on a solution to keep traffic moving along State Highway 71 in Bastrop County. It's a busy road with thousands of people

commuting to Austin every day. It's also a popular route to head to Houston.

Over the years, the number of drivers has increased along a two and a half mile stretch of SH 71 between County Road 206 and State Highway 21 from 30,555 drivers in 2013 to 37,234 in 2017.

Right now, TxDOT is finalizing plans for this stretch, but it comes with a catch. For some people, like Rebecca Killingsworth, who live and make a living in the area, the new project may leave them displaced.

Killingsworth said since she got the news about her potential move customers have asked her what she's going to do. She owns the Town and Country Barber Shop and has been cutting hair for 29 years in Cedar Creek. Her shop's walls are covered with memories.

"He's in high school now," she said pointing to a photo of her younger self with a toddler sitting in the styling chair.

Killingsworth's shop falls within the 32.5 acres of additional right-of-way needed for TxDOT's mobility project. This additional right-of-way may displace seven neighbors and 25 businesses.

Improvements include:

- Constructing new frontage roads
- Adding a bridge on SH 71 over the Farm-to-Market 1209 intersection

Adding shared-use paths for bicycles and pedestrians on both sides of SH 71 and FM 1209

- Improvements to FM 1209
- Adding turnarounds to the intersection of SH 71 and FM 1209
- Adding a turnaround to the intersection of SH 71 and SH 21

"Well, I know that's progress," Killingsworth said.

Killingsworth shop is not the only thing in danger of being displaced.

"I live right next door," she said. "I don't know what's going to really happen."

She admits, she's started looking and isn't sure what the future holds for her or whether she'll stay in the area.

"I haven't started biting my nails," she said laughing. "But you know I am concerned, I mean how can you replace this? I am praying to the good Lord."

In a previous [interview](#), TxDOT's Brad Wheelis said this project is part of a larger plan. TxDOT's SH 71 East Corridor project consists of five intersections along the highway where overpasses will be built.

"When we get these projects done, from Austin down to I-10, you will not have traffic signals," Wheelis said. "It'll be a clear shot from here and onto Houston, so it really will improve mobility heading to the east of Texas."

He added this project will not only improve mobility but safety along the busy highway by reducing the number of crash points.

The SH 71 and FM 1209 project is being finalized. The design should be completed by fall 2020 and the project will go out for bid in 2024. It is estimated to cost about \$37.5 million and construction is expected to begin summer 2024 with completion anticipated by winter 2025.

TxDOT officials said whenever they design a project, the team determines if any additional right-of-way is needed. If so, surveyors go out to determine exactly how much additional property is needed. Commercial and non-commercial property owners are identified and contacted.

Currently, TxDOT is in the middle of the surveying process and is expected to finish the process in the next few weeks. Once the surveying process is complete, TxDOT will contact independent appraisers to determine market value for each property to be acquired.

TxDOT officials added there are programs to assist those who may be displaced by a project. The programs include ongoing information about available replacement properties, financial assistance to get back into replacement housing and reimbursement of expenses necessary to move personal property. Financial assistance is available to businesses that need to relocate as well.

Tuesday night, there is a public hearing at the Bastrop Convention and Exhibit Center, 1408 Chestnut Street, Bastrop, Texas from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Bastrop County businesses, residents prepare for highway overpasses, displacement

For 37 years Benny Ochoa has watched Texas 71 swell from a rural country road to a major artery of Texas commerce. He bought his trailer house along the highway in Cedar Creek in 1982 and raised his sons at a time when “I could go out there and maybe see one or two cars go by, and that was about it.”

In 2006, after the Hyatt Regency Lost Pines was built a mile down the road from his home and shopping developments near Bastrop began to take root, he opened his business — Benny’s Texas Bar-B-Que — in Cedar Creek and watched the area’s growth unfold.

Now, the highway that has been the lifeblood of his business is swallowing his property. Ochoa’s barbecue joint, along with 24 other businesses and seven homes, is slated for demolition as the Texas Department of Transportation begins a \$37.5 million overpass project along Texas 71 at its intersection with FM 1209.

The project is part of TxDOT’s goal of eliminating five stoplights along Texas 71 between Bastrop and Austin. The department has also allocated \$48 million to build overpasses along the highway at Ross Road and Kellam Road in Del Valle — work that is set to begin as soon as this fall and be done by summer 2021. It also has earmarked \$52.6 million for overpasses at Tucker Hill Lane and Pope Bend Road near Cedar Creek, a two-year project tentatively expected to begin in 2020. These projects are aimed at increasing mobility and safety along the highway.

Ochoa is not yet sure if he’ll continue his barbecue business after TxDOT buys his property, a process that is ongoing. A heart attack in February left him indisposed for months and, as a 62-year-old, he’s considering leaving the restaurant industry for good.

“I don’t know what I’m going to do, to be perfectly honest,” he said. “After my heart attack, I felt that maybe it’s for the best, maybe something’s telling me to slow it down.”

Highway improvements come at a cost

Property acquisition for the right-of-ways needed for the overpass projects is a part of the process that’s difficult for all the parties involved, a TxDOT spokesperson said. The overpass projects at Tucker Hill Lane and Pope Bend Road could potentially displace an additional 45 businesses, the department said.

The overpass at FM 1209 calls for the acquisition of 32.5 acres along a 2.5-mile stretch of roadway. The project will add new frontage roads, shared-use paths on both sides of Texas 71 and FM 1209, add acceleration lanes and, among other improvements, a u-turn at the Texas 21 intersection — a feature the department added after receiving public feedback. TxDOT also said that plans for the project have not yet been finalized.

Despite the headache the surveying, appraisals and displacement are causing Ochoa, he said his front row seat to the highway has shown him the need for the proposed improvements.

“They’re really needed — for the safety of everybody and the school out here,” Ochoa said, referring to Cedar Creek High School, which is less than 2 miles from his restaurant. “They’re doing the right thing. They need this bad.”

But other residents are less amenable to TxDOT’s current plans. Some are concerned about how the project would affect emergency vehicle response times, others fear that the highway would eventually become tolled — a fear TxDOT officials dispelled by saying there are no current plans for new toll roads anywhere in the state.

Danny McCoy, who lives behind Ochoa’s barbecue joint, admonished TxDOT officials at a public hearing regarding the FM 1209 overpass project on Tuesday for not considering the degree to which the overpass would lengthen commute times by forcing people to drive several extra miles to reach a turnaround point. By his calculation, the extra 5 miles McCoy would be forced to drive each day as he takes his daughter to and from Cedar Creek High School would amount to \$2,262 in additional gas money annually.

“To me it looks like this design is from a set of overzealous engineers who like to put a lot of things on paper,” he said, adding that the department could shrink the highway’s grass medians instead of acquiring more right-of-way.

“We don’t need to wipe out our local businesses and sets of homes along 71 in order to make it faster for people (to get) from Houston to Austin,” McCoy said. “You’re destroying a lot of our lives and the way we work just to put in a bunch of frontage roads.”

Project engineers will continue fielding public feedback until May 15. By fall 2020, the department plans to finalize the project design. Construction would begin in 2024 and last through 2025, according to TxDOT.

“We don’t take lightly that this will impact people’s lives,” TxDOT spokesperson Brad Wheelis said. “But we also don’t take lightly that people die on these roads.”



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
TxDOT's project on SH 71 at FM 1209 will impact nearby homes, businesses

This project is part of a larger goal to remove stoplights there and at four other intersections along SH 71 between Austin and Bastrop.

AUSTIN, Texas — Roadwork along highway 71 between Austin and Bastrop over the next few years is supposed to cut down on traffic and make the highway safer.

It's also going to have a big impact on some homeowners and businesses.

TxDOT plans to remove traffic signals on SH 71 at five locations – Ross Road, Kellam Road, Tucker Hill, Pope Bend Road and FM 1209. It says the plan is to build overpasses in order to increase mobility along 71. It also says they're all separate projects with one common goal -- reducing traffic congestion and improving the safety of the stretch of highway.



"With the neighborhoods and population growth, we really need to address the congestion that's out there and we need to address safety in that area," said TxDOT spokesperson Brad Wheelis.

TxDOT told KVUE that in 2015 the stretch of highway handled 35,000 cars per day.


"Anytime you have a high rate of traffic, 60 miles an hour or more, when you ask folks to stop at a stoplight there are times where folks aren't paying attention, so they might run the stoplight. There are folks going to pull out at a stoplight, and they think they got enough time to accelerate and they don't. This causes crashes," said Wheelis. "If we remove the signals it's not a cure-all, but it goes a long way in improving that corridor."

[The plans](#) for the future overpasses include frontage roads.

For the case of the intersection [FM 1209 and SH 71, they'll need to tear down seven homes and 25 businesses along a 2.5-mile stretch](#). That way, there's enough right-of-way acreage for the project.

[As of right now](#), TxDOT says the environmental decision on the project would happen this summer; the design would move forward next fall, and construction would start in 2024.

"We want to make the least impact possible on homeowners and business owners in the area," said Wheelis.

TxDOT says those impacted by these future plans qualify for relocation assistance if needed. There is word yet on how much the property owners would get for their land.



TxDOT held a public hearing on April 30 at the Bastrop Convention and Exhibit Center, but it says the community outreach on the projects started in 2016 (2018 for the FM 1209 project).

[Benny's Texas Bar-B-Q](#) is one of the businesses that will have to go.

The popular BBQ joint has sat right on State Highway 71 for more than a decade.

"The highway kept growing, and just a lot more people out here," said Benny Ochoa, the owner, who bought the property in the early 1980s.

"You may see one, two, three cars in a row, and then maybe another 30 minutes you'd see two or three more," said Ochoa. "It's crazy. I mean it's 'zoom, zoom zoom' ... It's gotten crazy out here -- lot and lot of people -- and a lot more coming."

He says it's hard right now and he isn't sure about what to do after -- whether he will re-locate or have shut down the restaurant all together.

"I hate losing my place. I bought it here thinking I'd retire and it'd be mine forever," said Ochoa. "It's kind sad for these people."

But he also says he understands why it's needed.

1 MR. BISHOP: Good evening, everyone. My name is
2 Chris Bishop. I'm a Public Information Officer for the Texas
3 Department of Transportation, Austin District. Today is
4 April 30th. The official time is 6:30 P.M., and we'd like to
5 begin the public hearing for the proposed State Highway 71
6 improvements between County Road 206 and State Highway 21. I'd
7 like to note that this public hearing is only for
8 State Highway 71 between CR 206 and State Highway 21, and it
9 does not address any other proposed projects in the area.

10 I also would respectfully ask at this time if
11 you would turn off or silence any personal electronic devices
12 for the remainder of the hearing.

13 I'm going to be serving as your official Public
14 Hearing Officer tonight, so if you have any questions on this,
15 please feel free to come up and talk to me afterward. I'll
16 either get you answers or direct you to somebody who has them.

17 On behalf of TxDOT, I'd like to welcome you to
18 tonight's hearing. Thank you for your attendance, and we look
19 forward to receiving your comments.

20 If you made it through the door and did not sign
21 in, please do so either during the break or at least before
22 leaving so we have a record of everyone's attendance tonight.

23 At this time, we're going to take a moment to
24 recognize the local government officials who are present
25 tonight, and we have Billy Moore, Bastrop ISD. Mr. Moore?

1 There he is back there in the back.

2 Did I miss any other elected officials? Anybody
3 else manage to get in and we don't know about it?

4 Okay. I also want to recognize the personnel
5 from TxDOT on the project team that are here with us tonight.
6 If you would wave your hand or stand up or do something so
7 people know. Basically, it's anybody with a name tag. If you
8 have a question throughout the evening, feel free to look one
9 of them up, and if they don't know the answer, they will get
10 somebody who does.

11 I also would like to thank the Bastrop
12 Convention and Exhibit Center for allowing us to use this very
13 nice facility for tonight's hearing.

14 Now, the format of the hearing, after these
15 introductions, includes a presentation and then a public
16 comment session.

17 After these brief remarks, Jim Langston, who is
18 the project manager from our consulting partner, Bridgefarmer &
19 Associates, will present a summary of the proposed project,
20 give an overview of the environmental findings, and then I'm
21 going to come back and discuss the proposed right-of-way for
22 the project and TxDOT's acquisition procedures.

23 Again, we appreciate your being here to review,
24 discuss, and provide input on the project.

25 I'm going to take a moment and go off script,

1 because I hear about this from people, for a moment. Some of
2 the language you're going to hear this evening can be stilted
3 and repetitious. It's a very formal style. It meets legal
4 requirements, so please bear with us. All right?

5 Again, the purpose of this public hearing is to
6 provide an update on this project and receive public input on
7 the proposed improvements.

8 This public hearing is being recorded by a
9 certified court reporter for a formal record. We will prepare
10 a transcript of this hearing, so we do want to hear from you.
11 Please, either take the time to provide your input either by
12 filling out the comment form or speaking tonight. You can even
13 send in comments later.

14 In adhering to public hearing rules, we are not
15 allowed to answer questions or respond to comments during the
16 public comment section; however, the project team is going to
17 be available during the break it will take to answer your
18 questions one-on-one and also be available briefly at the end,
19 after the comment section.

20 Once again, if you wish to give a verbal comment
21 for tonight's formal comment session, please fill out a speaker
22 registration card. They're located over here at the sign-in
23 table. You can complete the card and leave it with the staff
24 there. Speakers will be called in the order that they have
25 submitted the cards. Elected officials will have a chance to

1 speak first because they're speaking on behalf of a
2 constituency.

3 Again, you can also provide verbal comments to
4 the court reporter during the break and, if you talk nicely,
5 maybe at the end. Just smile nicely at her.

6 There's also, again, the written comment form
7 that's available. If you would like to comment, but don't want
8 to do it verbally, or if you want to comment in more detail or
9 you think of something you want to add later, you can submit
10 those comments in writing. They can be mailed or submitted
11 online to the study team.

12 All comments to be included in the public
13 hearing comment record must be postmarked by May 15, 2019,
14 midnight Central Daylight Time. Your comments will be reviewed
15 and taken into consideration during future project development.
16 Our response to comments received will be provided in a comment
17 matrix at a later date in the Public Hearing Summary and
18 Analysis Report and posted at the TxDOT website, www.txdot.gov,
19 keyword search "SH 71 at FM 1209." Those search details ought
20 to be in the information sheet that you could have picked up
21 from the sign-in table.

22 All right. I'm going to turn the presentation
23 over to Jim Langston from Bridgefarmer & Associates, who will
24 discuss the project and provide the environmental overview.

25 MR. LANGSTON: Good evening. My name is

1 Jim Langston. I'm the Project Manager on the consulting team
2 for TxDOT for the State Highway 71 East Corridor Study, which
3 includes the proposed improvements along State Highway 71 from
4 County Road 206 to State Highway 121.

5 Now that Mr. Bishop has covered the format of
6 the public hearing and the ways to provide comments, I want to
7 share an overview of the proposed project.

8 Tonight's hearing is being held to discuss the
9 proposed project on State Highway 71 from County Road 206 to
10 State Highway 21. The project is located in Bastrop County.

11 The purpose of the proposed project is to
12 address increased congestion on State Highway 71, while
13 minimizing right-of-way, community and environmental impacts.
14 The proposed project would include: Constructing new frontage
15 roads, adding an overpass on State Highway 71 over the Farm to
16 Market 1209 intersection, adding shared-use paths on both sides
17 of State Highway 71 and Farm to Market 1209, making
18 improvements to Farm to Market 1209, and adding turnarounds to
19 the State Highway 71 and Farm to Market 1209 intersection.
20 Based on public input from the open house, a turnaround was
21 added at the intersection of State Highway 71 and
22 State Highway 21 as well as the adding of an acceleration lane
23 and improvements to the existing deceleration lane at the west
24 median break.

25 The proposed project is approximately

1 2 1/2 miles in length, 2.5 miles, and requires approximately
2 32.5 acres of right-of-way near the State Highway 71 from
3 County Road 206 to State Highway 21. It's anticipated that
4 seven residential properties and 25 non-residential properties
5 could be displaced.

6 For those with questions on right-of-way
7 acquisition, you can obtain information on the TxDOT Relocation
8 Assistance Program, benefits and services for those displaced,
9 and information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way
10 acquisition at tonight's hearing or from any district or area
11 office. Representatives from the TxDOT Austin District Right
12 of Way staff are here this evening, these people in the back
13 corner, and are available during a break to answer questions if
14 you were unable to talk with them during the open house.

15 Slide 7. This is an overview of the project
16 area for tonight's hearing. The map is also available on a
17 board in this room.

18 I will discuss the environmental studies
19 conducted for the project and the findings. A draft
20 environmental assessment (or an EA) and a series of technical
21 reports have been prepared for this project to determine the
22 anticipated impacts to the human and the natural environment.
23 The EA and the associated technical reports are available here
24 tonight and online at txdot.gov for your review.

25 An alternatives analysis was conducted to

1 determine the project alignment that would have the least
2 amount of impact to the human and the natural environment.
3 Three alternatives and the no-build scenario were evaluated;
4 one alternative that would acquire right-of-way from the north,
5 one alternative that would acquire right-of-way from the south,
6 and one alternative that would acquire right-of-way from both
7 sides of the existing roadway. A recommended preferred
8 alternative was developed that utilized parts of each alignment
9 to avoid impacts as much as possible. This preferred alignment
10 was what was used in the environmental analysis.

11 It was determined the proposed project would not
12 result in impacts to air quality.

13 A biological evaluation and a Tier I site
14 assessment were conducted to determine impacts to threatened
15 and endangered species. There would be no impacts to federally
16 listed species, and TxDOT would implement best management
17 practices and have coordinated with Texas Parks and Wildlife
18 Department to avoid impacts to state-listed species.

19 A hazardous materials initial site assessment
20 was conducted and determined additional information would be
21 needed to determine if there would be any potential hazardous
22 materials concerns associated with sites that could be
23 displaced by the proposed project activities or that the
24 project would require right-of-way from. These sites would
25 include three auto shops, a salvage yard, four sites with

1 petroleum storage tanks, and one site with a leaking petroleum
2 storage tank.

3 The proposed project would not impact any known
4 archeological sites or historic resources. Right of entry was
5 not available on all properties; therefore, an archeological
6 survey would be completed prior to construction, if the project
7 advances.

8 The proposed project is not anticipated to cause
9 any indirect impacts.

10 There would be no impacts to parklands.

11 A traffic noise impacts analysis was conducted
12 and determined that the proposed project would result in noise
13 impacts to five noise receivers. Noise walls were evaluated
14 but were determined to not be feasible and reasonable for any
15 of the receivers.

16 The proposed project activities would impact
17 less than a tenth of an acre of wetlands; therefore, the
18 proposed project would be permitted under a US Army Corps of
19 Engineers Nationwide Permit 14 with a Pre-Construction
20 Notification.

21 Again, the draft EA and environmental reports
22 are available for your review here tonight, and the draft EA is
23 available online at txdot.gov.

24 I will now turn it back to Mr. Bishop to discuss
25 the right-of-way.

1 MR. BISHOP: All right. Thank you, Jim.

2 In the meantime, since we started, I'd like to
3 mention another elected official who came in this evening,
4 Mel Hammer, Bastrop County Commissioner.

5 MR. HAMMER: Back here.

6 MR. BISHOP: There he is back in the back.
7 Welcome, sir.

8 As Jim mentioned, right-of-way is going to be
9 required for this project.

10 I'm sorry. Remember I mentioned something about
11 stilted and formal language? Here it comes. The State, acting
12 through the Texas Department of Transportation, will be
13 appointing an authorized agent who will be responsible for the
14 acquisition of necessary right-of-way and for all relocation
15 services. Acquisitions will be made in accordance with Federal
16 and State statutes and guidelines.

17 The primary federal law which sets the
18 guidelines for right-of-way acquisitions and relocation
19 assistance is found in the Uniform Relocation Assistance and
20 Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, commonly
21 referred to as the Uniform Act. This law sets the standards
22 for appraisal, negotiations, and relocations and has also been
23 incorporated into Texas State Law, as set out in the Texas
24 Transportation Code and the Texas Property Code. For a basis
25 review of your rights and TxDOT's obligations, I would

1 recommend you pick up one of the brochures entitled State
2 Purchase of Right of Way as well as the Relocation Assistance
3 booklet, both of which are available at the right-of-way table
4 back in the back corner or electronically on the TxDOT website,
5 and directions on the department's web page are also available,
6 if you need help finding it, back at the right-of-way table.

7 TxDOT will be contracting with a consultant to
8 coordinate acquisition and relocation activities. Independent
9 fee appraisers will be contracted to appraise all necessary
10 property. Affected property owners will receive written
11 notification of the pending appraisal inspection. Appraisers
12 will request permission to enter a property for inspection and
13 offer the property owner, or their representative, the right to
14 accompany them on the inspection. The appraiser will be asked
15 to determine the value of the land to be acquired, real
16 property improvements within the area to be acquired, and
17 damages (if any) to the remaining property. The written
18 appraisal will be provided to the landowner at the time the
19 offer is made.

20 Now, this project is fully funded. If
21 environmental clearance has been obtained and the project has
22 been fully authorized, TxDOT's acquiring agent will commence
23 the acquisition process. This agent will send each property
24 owner an offer letter along with a copy of the appraisal. That
25 letter, together with the appraisal, will advise each affected

1 owner as to the value of the land to be acquired, the value of
2 any improvements within the acquisition area, and damages (if
3 any) to the remaining property. Each property owner can choose
4 to accept the offer based on the appraisal or make a
5 counter-offer based on additional information that may affect
6 the value of the land under consideration. If no agreement can
7 be reached, the State will obtain authorizations to proceed
8 with eminent domain proceedings.

9 Now, the initial stage of an eminent domain
10 proceeding is what's known as a Special Commissioners Hearing.
11 In the Special Commissioners Hearing, a judge with jurisdiction
12 over such proceedings will appoint three Special Commissioners
13 to hear the evidence of both the landowner and TxDOT. The
14 Special Commissioners Hearing is generally informal, usually
15 not in a courtroom. Rather, in a public meeting room. A
16 property owner may hire an attorney to represent them in the
17 proceeding or appear on their own behalf. Based on the
18 testimony given, the Special Commissioners issue an award,
19 which is their determination of value. Once the State has
20 deposited the amount of this award in the registry of the
21 court, it has a right of possession to the property. Either
22 the landowner or the State can appeal the award of Special
23 Commissioners, and then a court proceeding will be scheduled to
24 resolve the issue of value.

25 In all cases, the property owner will be

1 reimbursed for any reasonable and incidental expenses
2 necessarily incurred in transferring title to the acquired
3 property to the State. Expenses eligible for reimbursement
4 generally include recording fees and similarly required
5 expenses to convey the real property along with any penalties
6 that are required for a prepayment of preexisting recorded
7 mortgage entered into in good faith encumbering the property.

8 The State of Texas is required, through the
9 Federal and State laws that were previously mentioned, to
10 assist persons being displaced from their homes and businesses
11 because of highway projects. Again, as previously mentioned,
12 this project will require property acquisition. The State will
13 be required to comply with the provisions mandated by federal
14 and state law to minimize the impact and financial hardships to
15 persons being displaced. TxDOT has available Relocation
16 Assistance booklets, which will provide a general overview of
17 the Relocation Assistance Program. Those booklets outline the
18 services offered and any payments for which displaced
19 individuals, families, businesses, and nonprofit organizations
20 may be eligible to receive. If you have an interest or feel
21 you may be affected by this proposed project, I encourage you
22 to pick up one of those brochures before leaving tonight.

23 If you have any questions regarding this matter,
24 please feel free to visit with our right-of-way staff,
25 including Taylor Hibbens, in the back corner at that table.

1 They'll be happy to provide you with any additional information
2 or details that you might need.

3 In terms of project timeline, we anticipate that
4 the projects will receive an environmental decision this
5 summer, 2019, with anticipated project design completed in
6 Fall 2020. Once right-of-way is acquired and utilities
7 relocated, we anticipate bid to go out for construction, and
8 that would start in the Summer of 2024, estimated completion
9 Winter 2025.

10 As I stated earlier, the main purpose of this
11 hearing is to hear from you and to provide an opportunity for
12 you to comment on the project.

13 We are ready to take a break. Please feel free
14 to review the project materials, ask questions of the team
15 members back at the display tables, and, again, if you would
16 like to provide verbal comments on the project, fill out a
17 speaker registration card back here at the sign-in table. You
18 can turn them in there. We will put you in the queue. All
19 comments received, verbal or written, will be included in the
20 official public hearing record.

21 After a ten-minute recess, we will come back to
22 receive those verbal comments, so please ask your questions of
23 the study team during the recess. Again, they're the ones
24 wearing the name badges. They're ready to meet with you.
25 We're going to take that recess, give you the opportunity to do

1 that. The time is 6:48. We will reconvene at 6:58. We are
2 currently in recess.

3 (Recess from 6:48 P.M. to 6:58 P.M.)

4 MR. BISHOP: If everyone would please work your
5 way back to your seat, please, so we can begin the public
6 comment section. We're going to reconvene. It is 6:58.

7 One point I'd like to make is that nothing that
8 you have seen here or that has been presented is final. It is
9 all subject to change based on the written and verbal comments
10 that we receive. And just as a reminder, during the verbal
11 comment section, we will not be able to answer questions.
12 That's a time that is set aside for you to provide comments.

13 Once again, anybody who wants to, please go to
14 the speakers' table to sign up or turn in a speaker's card. We
15 do have some more of them there.

16 If you don't want to stand and speak tonight,
17 you can write down your comments. Written comments can be
18 placed -- we have a comment box in the back. They can also be
19 mailed or emailed to the study team.

20 I'm going to call out the names of people who
21 signed up to speak so their comments can be included in the
22 record. In order to assure that everyone has an equal
23 opportunity to speak, we'll limit comments to three minutes.
24 After three minutes, you'll be asked to be seated so the next
25 speaker can make their comments.

1 You will also see up on the screen a countdown.
2 We'll ask you to come forward and turn to the microphone. Make
3 sure that you address the court reporter and me because the
4 court reporter needs to capture your comments, and I can help
5 to serve as your focal point as well. So use that microphone
6 there.

7 We'll ask, also, that you state your name before
8 speaking. We'll take the speakers in the order that they are
9 signed up.

10 So our first speaker is Dale Slaughter.

11 MR. SLAUGHTER: My name is Dale Slaughter. I
12 live on 1209, and I'm very concerned about the dust on this
13 project and request you do everything you can to stop the dust.
14 And I want to know, in the future, is there any plans to make
15 Highway 71 a toll road?

16 MR. BISHOP: Our second speaker for this evening
17 is Thomas Rosser.

18 MR. ROSSER: I'm Thomas Rosser. I live in
19 The Colony. I have one primary concern. I looked at the
20 various options that I have to get to my house after the
21 project is complete. The least impact to my house is three
22 minutes. Doesn't sound like a problem until you understand
23 that that means that that fire truck is delayed by three
24 minutes; the EMT is delayed by three minutes.

25 I looked at the Heart Association that says

1 brain death can start in four to six minutes. CPR not being
2 provided, it's a 7 percent to 10 percent degradation for every
3 single minute.

4 So I have talked to people. I would like to see
5 if there was a way to change -- to provide access from
6 eastbound State 71 north through a tunnel -- you'd have to have
7 a significant raise in the roadbed at that point to have a
8 sufficient tunnel height -- to alleviate that three-minute
9 delay for the currently 600, soon to be, hopefully soon,
10 thousands of additional residents in The Colony to not
11 encounter that extra three-minute delay.

12 MR. BISHOP: Thank you, sir.

13 Deborah Bynum.

14 MS. BYNUM: Hi. I'm Deborah Bynum. We've got
15 property on 71, and I just found out tonight that all access to
16 that property headed eastbound has been cut off unless you go
17 all the way down to a bridge that hasn't been built yet, and so
18 I have no idea how hard it will be to turn around.

19 The gentleman prior to me voiced some concerns
20 about the lack of access -- being able to access the property,
21 so I, too, would like to know if there's going to be some
22 ability to cut into property without having to go a mile or
23 more down the road to do a turnaround. It also significantly
24 impacts future use of the land, which I think is not a good
25 thing, and suspect the appraisers won't take that into

1 consideration.

2 Also, since it seems to be about getting Houston
3 people to Austin faster, I want to know if rapid transport was
4 considered. Why build a road? Why not do a rapid transport
5 thing and just avoid this whole mess? I haven't seen anything
6 in the press about rapid transport being considered; although,
7 of course, we've talked about that in this region for the last
8 20 years or longer.

9 I think a prior speaker also raised a concern
10 about having this turn into a toll road, which will further
11 compromise the ability to access property, and I -- I don't
12 know whether there's any plans to turn 71 into a toll road, but
13 that's an obvious concern. Thank you.

14 MR. BISHOP: Thank you.

15 Dr. Danny McCoy.

16 MR. MCCOY: Hello. I'm Danny McCoy. I live on
17 [REDACTED]. I'm impacted by this with the west end of
18 frontage roads and -- coming into my neighborhood. I think
19 most everybody in here agrees that we need something at 1209.
20 It is dangerous, the lights, people running, speeds, and all
21 that.

22 What I have a problem with is the impact to
23 those of us that have lived there for a very long time. I've
24 been here 17 years, and I've got neighbors that -- I've got no
25 idea how long they've been there because they were well

1 established long before I got there.

2 My daughter goes to high school at Cedar Creek;
3 my other daughter goes to elementary school at Bluebonnet, and
4 I've got a one-year-old that'll follow the same cycle if I even
5 stay around here. I take my daughter to and from school at the
6 high school every day. It's very simple. I exit, go to the
7 high school, come back, turn, cross the median, and right into
8 my driveway.

9 Based on the way it is now, I will have to drive
10 an extra 5 miles every time I take my daughter to school. I
11 pick her up once a day. I drop her off once a day. I also
12 head into Austin a few times each week.

13 So at a simple 15 times a week, having to make
14 this new turnaround, going to 1209, turning around, coming back
15 this frontage road, I'm looking at spending an extra \$2,262 a
16 year in lost gas, transportation costs on that, and that's
17 just, you know, a simple 15. I'm sure there's plenty of my,
18 you know, local residents near me that have to drive that as
19 many times or often.

20 Have you impacted that on the people? Have you
21 told us what -- the extra cost of us driving, just the simple
22 things that we do every day? To me, it looks like this design
23 was either a set of overzealous engineers, who just like to put
24 a lot of things on paper and it looks really good, or there's
25 some potential corruption behind it.

1 Removing all those homes and businesses on the
2 west side of 1209, there's no need in it. You can narrow the
3 median. You can keep the frontage roads if you really want to
4 and those businesses. Wiping those businesses out sounds like
5 some kind of plan to eventually acquire those lands for other
6 people who are looking to build strip malls or a bunch of other
7 things.

8 I don't think we're interested in that in our
9 little area in Wyldwood. We got a light up there because we
10 needed it to get back and forth at one time. 1209's not that
11 important of a road. People use it to get to and from their
12 houses. They get to the school. They use it as a quick cutoff
13 to 1209. It's a local road.

14 We don't need to wipe out our entire local
15 businesses and sets of homes along 71 in order to build a road
16 to make it faster for people from Houston and Austin. You're
17 destroying a lot of our lives and the way we work just to put
18 in a bunch of frontage roads. Narrow your design. Change it.
19 Eliminate some of those frontage roads. Thank you.

20 MR. BISHOP: Thank you, sir.

21 There are no more verbal comments, so we are
22 going to conclude this part of the public hearing. Again, all
23 comments that we receive on the State Highway 71 between
24 County Road 206 and State Highway 21 project tonight, as well
25 as those received by May 15, 2019, will be summarized,

1 analyzed, and responded to in a report. Comments and responses
2 will be available to the public through the TxDOT website at
3 txdot.gov, searching for "SH 71 at FM 1209." It will also be
4 addressed in the final environmental document.

5 That concludes the public hearing. I want to
6 thank you for attending. There are a lot of things that you
7 could have been doing this evening, and we hope that you can
8 get back to doing them and, of course, getting to do them
9 safely.

10 The time right now is 7:08. This hearing is
11 officially adjourned. Good night.
