Governor, president spotlight actions in pandemic, economic downturn

AUSTIN — Texas, along with the rest of the nation and the world, continued to battle the COVID-19 pandemic last week as cases and deaths attributed to the novel coronavirus increased.

Gov. Greg Abbott on May 7 met with President Trump in the White House. The president praised Abbott's leadership in handling the months-long medical emergency and in managing the resulting slowdown of the economy in the Lone Star State.

Abbott said Texas has one of the lowest COVID-19 death rates in the country, noting that half of the state's 254 counties have no cases or five or fewer cases of the virus.

He said we have the knowledge and resources to contain COVID-19, adding that "It's the people of Texas who have done a great job of slowing the spread" by washing their hands, wearing masks and practicing social distancing.

"Because of that, we are now seeing more and more businesses that are opening up gradually to make sure we don't expand the spread, but we're doing so in a way that we'll make sure Texas will once again

reclaim its position as being the number one economy in the United States," the governor said.

Trump asked about the Dallas-area beauty salon owner who was arrested and jailed for violating one of Abbott's executive orders by prematurely opening for business. "She's free today," the governor said during the Oval Office meeting, adding that authorities should exercise common sense in carrying out his executive orders. In the wake of the beauty salon case, Abbott modified his executive orders related to COVID-19 to eliminate confinement as a punishment for violating the orders.

On May 10, cumulative figures posted by the Texas Department of State Health Services showed that some 37,860 people in Texas had been diagnosed with COVID-19, and 1,049 deaths resulting from the influenza-like virus had been confirmed.

TEA: Graduation guidance

The Texas Education Agency on May 5 announced graduation guidance for the class of 2020. Under the guidelines, ceremonies may take place as early as May 15 as the state continues the reopening of services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

While school buildings remain closed to normal

in-classroom instruction for the remainder of the 2019-20 academic year, the TEA, in coordination with the governor's Strike Force to Open Texas, is providing four different pathways for schools to celebrate their graduating seniors:

— Virtual ceremonies that take place entirely online with the use of videoconference or other technologies;

— Hybrid ceremonies consisting of a compilation of videos of students being recognized in person as they celebrate graduation in small groups;

— Vehicle ceremonies, in which students and their families wait in their cars while other graduates are recognized one at time with their families alongside them; and

— Outdoor in-person ceremonies, which are currently permitted for certain counties.

Texas Education Commissioner Mike Morath said that "by taking the necessary precautions developed by medical experts, we can ensure we appropriately honor our class of 2020 graduates while keeping everyone safe."

AG joins in crackdown

Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton on May 4 joined a coalition of 52 attorneys general in a letter to the Washington, D.C.-based broadband industry association USTelecom, urging the association's members to continue developing robocall traceback and other capabilities suited to law

enforcement needs.

Paxton and his colleagues said they anticipate an increase in enforcement and a need for increased investigative support from leading voice service providers.

"Texans' private phones are bombarded by constant calls that invade their privacy and often attempt to defraud them of their hard-earned money," Paxton said.

Preparedness week proclaimed

Gov. Abbott on May 4 issued a proclamation declaring May 3 through May 9 as Hurricane Preparedness Week in Texas.

In his proclamation, the governor asks all Texans to take steps to protect themselves and their loved ones from the danger and destruction that hurricanes can bring.

"There are no substitutes for having emergency supplies and a well-prepared emergency plan to protect yourself, your family," Abbott said. He encouraged Texans to visit the Texas Ready webpage, texasready.gov, to learn more about the steps they can take now to prepare for hurricane season.

Hurricane season starts June 1 ends on Nov. 30.

The turning radius on both 190 and 4th and Key Ave/4th are not compatible with truck traffic.	4th Street in Lampasas is not a truck by-pass and therefore, trucks are allowed to use this roadway just like other public roadways without truck restrictions. TxDOT will begin working with the City of Lampasas to try to improve the curb radius especially at 4th Street and Key Avenue.

Several years ago County Road 361 (Brown County) and County Road 149 (Comanche County) flowed together over a railroad track. As I understand, Txdot , closed these roads at the railroad crossing in agreement with Comanche when they built the overpass in Comanche, Texas on Hwy 377 into town.

However, problem rises when someone uses a GPS to find these roads. They think you can still go from CR 361 to CR 149 (cut through) to access either Hwy 1467 or CR 145.

I live on CR 361 and have many many vehicles come down and find out they cannot get through. There is no place to turn around. At the time of closure, first responders were not even notified. We had fire departments and sheriff vehicles coming down CR 361 as a cut through only to be stopped at the railroad. Yes small signs were placed at the beginning of each road as **Dead End Road**, but if people are using GPS they still assume they can get through.

Can you help as to how to show these roads **do not connect** if usng a GPS..

This would help motorist traveling the Txdot roadways.





The Rural Transportation Improvement Program is a list of local projects funded in a TxDOT District over the next four years. This means that all projects included in the list are expected to be underway within four years following its approval. These are the projects you can expect to go to contract in the near future.

It is multimodal; which means that it can include projects relating to highways, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, transit services, and freight projects as well as the preliminary studies used to define those projects.

The Rural TIP is meant to show regional agreement on the need and priority of a transportation project, so all parties involved can be sure they are making the best investment for the community. A TIP is also expected to be consistent with the projects and objectives included in the regional Long Range Transportation Plans, to ensure that all agencies are working toward the same goal.

The Rural TIP is also part of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Because the program rules are established by Federal law, no project can receive federal funding unless it is included in the STIP.

The Rural TIP process includes opportunities to provide input on the priority of major projects that are listed on it.









Here is a map showing the projects proposed in Eastland County.






Here is a map showing the projects proposed in Mills County.

Funding

The Rural TIP is a fiscally constrained list of projects that functions as a budgeting tool for our District.

Funds can come from:

- Federal Government**
Through the Federal Highway and Transit Administrations
- TxDOT**
Through its Unified Transportation Program funding categories
- Local governments**
Who may be required to provide matching funds for federal monies

“Fiscally constrained TIP” means:
It is realistic in terms of the amount of funding available.


2021-2024 Rural TIP May 28, 2020

The Rural TIP functions as a budget list for the District. As such, it is fiscally constrained. Like the budget of a household, the Rural TIP has to be realistic about the amount of money available to cover all the needs. Frequently, we identify more improvements than we have money to implement. This means prioritizing according to those items that are most necessary.

We’ve discussed the list, but where is the money coming from? Funds can come from three main sources:

- The Federal Government, through the establishment of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, or Fast Act. The federal government allocates these funds through the processes established by the Federal Highway and Transit Administrations.
- TxDOT, like the Federal Government, also allocates a section of our budget for these projects through the Unified Transportation Program’s 12 funding categories.

And 3) the local governments. Once the need has been identified and the amount of federal monies has been defined, the Rural TIP helps local governments assess the funding requirements to match those of the federal and state government along with their capacity to meet them.



This slide shows the general progression of the Rural TIP process and where we are right now. Once your comments have been collected and reviewed, any necessary revisions will be made to the Rural TIP before it is submitted for approval and integration into the statewide document.

The Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is built from the Rural TIPs of all of the 25 Districts in the State as well as the Transportation Improvement Programs from all the MPOs. Once the STIP is approved by the federal government, the included projects become one step closer to getting on the ground.
