

multi-million dollar bond election, and some Comanche County residents fall into Hamilton ISD's school district, so a Comanche County election must be held for those voters. All approved. Commissioners also approved a joint election agreement between Comanche County and Hamilton ISD.

Commissioners also acknowledged an order from District Judge Shaun Carpenter setting a public hearing to review and set the annual budget for the county auditor, any assistant auditor, and the compensation for the 220th Judicial District Court Reporter.

The court then discussed entering into an interlocal agreement with Lubbock County that would provide insurance for a public defender in the event that Comanche County holds a capital murder trial. The cost for the service would be \$5,700. Commissioner Johnson said he thought it would be a good idea, and Judge Davis agreed, calling it the "responsible" thing to do. .23.2 A capital murder trial would cost the county at least six figures.

.23.2 However, it was decided that the county would look into all options for this type of insurance, and discuss the matter again at the next meet-

ing of the commissioners' court.

Commissioners then discussed amending their rules of procedure for meetings of the commissioners' court. According to Judge Davis, House Bill 2840, which goes into effect on September 1, requires that government entities such as commissioners' courts allow every citizen the chance to speak at meetings. It also forbids governmental entities from prohibiting criticism of governmental actions.

In Emergency Management Operations Tricia Grimshaw reported that the burn ban should not be lifted.

A Budget Workshop was conducted afterward. County Auditor Joey Boswell presented a theoretical budget

based on the same tax rate as last year, \$0.62996 per \$100 valuation. That budget ran at a significant, albeit improved, deficit, and included a 3 percent pay raise for employees. Commissioners Sherman Sides, Jimmy Dale Johnson, and Corky Underwood all expressed interest in budgeting for capital murder insurance. Sides and Underwood were also vocal in their support for additional county funding for fire departments throughout the county. Judge Davis also indicated her desire to pro-

vide \$35 in monthly monetary compensation for county employees for their private cell phone use. Davis said she was concerned that employees were using their private phones to conduct business without compensation. She also expressed concern that, in doing so, county employees had made their private phones subject to the open meetings act.

4 The verbal public comment session will
5 begin following the presentation. We will not answer
6 questions during the presentation or public comment
7 session due to the format of public hearings, but we
8 will be available to answer your questions following the
9 comment session. This official public hearing will
10 adjourn after all verbal comments have been heard.

11 The proposed project limits along State
12 Highway 6, otherwise known as East Navarro Street, are
13 from State Highway 16 North, to East DeLeon City Limits
14 in Comanche County, a distance of approximately two

16 The proposed improvements are needed to
17 provide an alternative route when incidents obstruct the
18 roadway and during emergency evacuations, to accommodate

9 Approximately 0.706 acres located along the southern
10 boundary of the park would be required for permanent
11 incorporation into the proposed transportation facility.
12 A Section 4(f) de minimis finding means that the
13 proposed project would not adversely affect the
14 activities, features, or attributes that qualify the
15 DeLeon Festival Gardens Community Park for protection
16 under Section 4(f).

17 As seen in this illustration, the existing
18 roadway consists of two 12-foot travel lanes with 4-foot
19 shoulders and a 14-foot continuous center turn lane.
20 The proposed project would include the addition of a
21 travel lane in each direction, 5-foot sidewalks on each
22 side of the road for the majority of the project length,
23 storm sewer installation, water and wastewater upgrade,
24 and illumination.

The project length is approximately two miles and would require approximately 3.04 acres of additional right of way. No displacements of commercial or residential properties are anticipated.

Chapter 26 Texas Parks and Wildlife Code and Section 4(f)

The Sept. 17, 2019, Chapter 26 public hearing will discuss the proposed project's potential impacts to 0.706 acres of the De Leon Festival Gardens Community Park. As part of this project, TxDOT is considering a Section 4(f) *de minimis* impact determination for impacts to the De Leon Festival Gardens Community Park. Approximately 0.706 acres located along the southern boundary of the park would be required for permanent incorporation into the proposed transportation facility. A Section 4(f) *de minimis* finding means that the proposed project would not adversely affect the activities, features, or attributes that qualify the De Leon Festival Gardens Community Park for protection under Section 4 (f). The City of De Leon and TxDOT will consider comments received during the environmental process before making a final Section 4(f) *de minimis* determination.

Hospital District to reduce taxes three percent

The Comanche County Consolidated Hospital District Board met in a called meeting on Tuesday to debate a proposed tax rate for the upcoming year.

All Board Directors were present, including President Barbara Williams, Vice President Joe Locke, Secretary Gil Gilbert, and directors Marvin McKinnon, Kim Lampman, and George Bingham.

Plainly spoken was the fact that the hospital district and Comanche County

Medical Center were experiencing a great wave of recent success.

As a result, the board agreed to propose a lower tax rate than last year, lowering the rate to \$0.313937 per \$100 valuation, a decrease of about three percent from last year's rate of \$0.328050.

"We're in the best fiscal position we've ever been in," said Locke. "Hospital and district revenue has greatly improved, and we're looking for better im-

provement in future years."

Locke acknowledged that the cost of indigent care had increased, but said that the intergovernmental transfer program that the hospital district has in place would handle that increase.

"I agree with lowering the rate," said hospital CEO Dr. Larry Troxell. "We're really doing well with the way we are developing out affiliations and service areas, and improving the strength of that. We are working in See CCMC page 8

Board to issue additional general obligation bonds, in an amount that does not exceed \$200 million, for the economically distressed areas program. These bonds can only be used to provide financing for the development of water supply and sewer service projects in those economically distressed areas as defined by law.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of additional general obligation bonds by the Texas Water Development Board in an amount not to exceed \$200 million to provide financial assistance for the development of certain projects in economically distressed areas."

Proposition Number 3 (HJR 34)

HJR 34 proposes a constitutional amendment allowing the legislature to temporarily exempt from ad valorem taxation a portion of certain property located in an area covered by a disaster declaration of the governor. The proposed amendment would allow the legislature to prescribe the method of determining the amount of the tax exemption and the duration of the exemption and also would allow the legislature to create any additional eligibility requirements for the tax exemption.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for a temporary exemption from ad valorem taxation of a portion of the appraised value of certain property damaged by a disaster."

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment dedicating the revenue received from the existing state sales and use taxes that are imposed on sporting goods to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the Texas Historical Commission to protect Texas' natural areas, water quality, and history by acquiring, managing, and improving state and local parks and historic sites while not increasing the rate of the state sales and use taxes."

Proposition Number 6 (HJR 12)

HJR 12 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to increase the maximum bond amount for the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) from

\$3 billion to \$6 billion to be issued by the Texas Public Finance Authority. CPRIT was created in 2007 to promote and fund cancer research in Texas. CPRIT uses bond proceeds to award grants for cancer research and prevention.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to increase by \$3 billion the maximum bond amount authorized for the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas."

Proposition Number 7 (HJR 151)

HJR 151 proposes a constitutional amendment allowing increased distributions from \$300 million per year to \$600 million per year to the available school fund and also allowing the State Board of Education, the General Land Office, and other entities that manage revenue from land or other properties held in the permanent school fund to dis-

financing of drainage, nook mitigation, and flood control projects."

Proposition Number 9 (HJR 95)

HJR 95 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to create a property tax exemption for precious metal held in a precious metal depository located in this state.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation precious metal held in a precious metal depository located in this state."

Proposition Number 10 (SJR 32)

SJR 32 proposes a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to allow a state agency or political subdivision to transfer a law enforcement animal to the animal's handler or another qualified caretaker in certain circumstances. Currently, the Texas Constitution prevents the transfer of certain public property, such as law enforcement animals, to a private person or organization at no cost. This amendment authorizes the legislature to allow the transfer of a law enforcement animal to the animal's handler or another qualified caretaker at no cost, upon the animal's retirement or at another time if the transfer is determined to be in the animal's best interest.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to allow the transfer of a law enforcement animal to a qualified caretaker in certain circumstances."
