

Join us for the US 77 Woodsboro/Refugio Route Study open house to discuss preliminary and conceptual improvements to US 77 (from south of Woodsboro to north of Refugio) to upgrade to a controlled access facility that meets interstate standards. The meeting will be a come-and-go format and project team members will be on hand to answer questions and provide information. The study is the initial stage of project development and public involvement will remain a vital element and will be continuous throughout all stages.

Overview

The US 77 Woodsboro/Refugio Route Study builds on the recommendations and progress of the I-69 Advisory Committee and the I-69 Segment Committee. The study is reviewing potential route options and environmental constraints for developing I-69 from the city of Woodsboro to the city of Refugio.


Three conceptual route options from Woodsboro to Refugio identified include:

- A route east of the existing US 77
- A route west of the existing US 77
- A route along the existing US 77 route

Project Purpose and Need

The purpose and need of the US 77 Woodsboro/Refugio Route Study is to identify US 77 route options that would provide a continuous access-controlled facility that meets interstate standards for future I-69E route designation; improve safety for local and through traffic; improve mobility, access, and connectivity; and enhance economic vitality.
