





Project Limit



- Remove the existing bricks
- Repair the base and subbase of the road
- Put the bricks back to finish the road
- Widen the sidewalks
- Replace/install Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)- compliant curb ramps
- Relocate existing utilities that are in conflict



Purpose

- Improve mobility
- Enhance access
- Enhance safety

Objectives

- Repair the roadway base and subbase
- Reuse the existing bricks for the roadway surface
- Provide ADA-compliant pedestrian accommodations

- Existing bricks can be reused
- City has a stockpile of additional bricks to replace any broken bricks; there are 5,000 bricks available
- Install ADA-compliant ramps
- On-street parking will become uniformly parallel parking at the City of Grandview's request
- On-street parking will be better defined by the widened sidewalks
- Speed study will be conducted after the completion of the project



Other Considerations




- The City of Grandview will be constructing a large parking area for the downtown area on the east side of downtown
- The parking area is expected to be constructed next year



Proposed sidewalk widening and ADA-compliant ramps will enhance pedestrian accommodations.

- Estimated construction cost: \$1,598,000
 - \$1,460,000 for brick and sidewalk improvements
 - \$138,000 for the City of Grandview's water line relocation

Prior to December 16, 2014, the Federal Highway Administration, otherwise known as FHWA, reviewed and approved documents prepared under the National Environmental Policy Act, known as NEPA. However, on December 16, 2014, the Texas Department of Transportation assumed responsibility from the FHWA for reviewing and approving certain assigned NEPA environmental documents. This memorandum of understanding was renewed on December 9, 2019. This review and approval process apply to this proposed project.
