




### SH 3 Access Management Study

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is coordinating an access management study for State Highway (SH) 3 from Brookglen Drive to the Harris/Galveston County line.

The purpose of access management is to provide vehicular access to land development in a manner that preserves the safety and efficiency of the transportation system. The study aims to identify short-, medium-, and long-range improvements to reduce crashes, improve mobility, and support existing and future development.
