## Public Meeting Summary

On June 27, 2017, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) held a Public Meeting at the TxDOT Lufkin District Office in Lufkin, Texas from 4 to 7 p.m. to display conceptual layouts and gather public input and comments on the proposed project. The public provided a total of 7 comments as part of the outreach process. The comments and responses are included in **Attachment A** of this report.

## Outreach Methods

The Lufkin District employed ten outreach methods to inform and invite the public to attend. Efforts were made to reach the Limited English Proficiency (LEP) populations by translating flyers and mailings and advertising in a Spanish language newspaper, as well as offering interpreters, if requested. Copies of the outreach methods are included in **Attachment B**.

### Methods

- Letters to Elected Officials, Affected Property Owners, and Local Stakeholders – on June 1, 2017, letters were mailed to area elected officials and representatives, 65 affected property owners, and 20 area stakeholders.
- Postcards – postcards were mailed to 721 addresses on June 16, 2017.
- Water Bill Notices – the meeting information was printed on the Redland Water Supply Corporation water bills that were mailed to 942 addresses on June 26, 2017.
- Display Ads - advertisements were published in English in *The Daily Sentinel* and *The Lufkin Daily News* on June 20, 2017, and in Spanish in *La Lengua* on June 21, 2017.
- News Release – a news release was sent to various media outlets within the project area.
- Electronic Changeable Message Signs – TxDOT's electronic message boards were placed on US 59 northbound and southbound near the project limits at least one week prior to the meeting. These signs were up as notifications from June 20-27, 2017.
- Flyers – Two weeks prior to the meeting flyers were left at businesses near the project area (i.e. grocery store, churches, restaurants) for patrons to take.
- Websites – TxDOT posted the US 59 Upgrade Redland public meeting website on June 1, 2017. It included information on the date, time, location and purpose, as well as the meeting materials including exhibit materials, newsletter, notifications, and project maps.
- Social Media Information – the Open House was promoted through TxDOT Twitter and Facebook accounts the day of the meeting.

Members of the public who attended the meeting were asked to indicate how they heard about the meeting as they signed in. Not all attendees indicated a notification method and some indicated more than one. The results from this query are shown in Table 1.

### **Public Meeting Format**

The meeting was an open house format allowing the public to come and go to not only view exhibit boards and schematic drawings but also speak to TxDOT staff one-on-one regarding the proposed project.

### **Registration and Handouts**

Upon arrival, attendees were asked to sign-in and were offered a set of handouts which included a project specific TxDOT Lufkin District June 2017 Newsletter and a comment form. Copies of the sign-in sheets are in **Attachment C**. Copies of the handouts provided at the meeting are available in **Attachment E**.

### **Exhibits and Displays**

Eight project-specific informational boards were displayed for the public to view, which included: a Welcome/Meeting Overview board, Project Purpose and Need, Project Location, I-69 Progress in Texas, I-69 System Status by State, Proposed Improvements, Typical Section, Next Steps, and a board providing mechanisms to stay informed. Two identical project schematic roll plot drawings were also displayed. A laptop computer was set up to display the proposed project specifics on a background of Google aerial imagery. This allowed interested attendees and property owners to zoom in on the area of interest and take a closer look at more details on the aerial photograph. Documentation of the exhibits and displays have been included in **Attachment E**.

### **Comments and Responses**

The public was invited to submit comments on the project. Attendees had the option of leaving their completed comment forms in the drop boxes provided, submitting verbal comment to the available court reporter, or submitting their comment by email, fax or mail by July 12, 2017. A total of 7 written comments were received. No verbal comments were provided to the court reporter. As mentioned above, each comment received and written responses are included in the comment response matrix in **Attachment A**. Copies of the original comments can be found in **Attachment D**.

George P. Bush seeks re-election as Texas land commissioner

AUSTIN — George P. Bush on Monday formally announced he is seeking re-election as Texas land commissioner next year, hoping to continue running a little-known but powerful agency in a state where his political-dynasty family has been prominent for decades.

Bush's grandfather, President George H.W. Bush, was once a Texas congressman and his uncle, George W. Bush, won two Texas gubernatorial elections before leaving for the White House.

George P. Bush, 41, grew up in Florida, where his father, Jeb, was governor and launched his unsuccessful presidential campaign last year. The younger Bush won the position of Texas' land commissioner handily in 2014, becoming the first in his family to win his first election.

Study: Oil, gas drilling connected to pollution, earthquakes

HOUSTON — A new study by a nonprofit science organization says oil and gas drilling in Texas is linked to pollution and earthquakes.

The Academy of Medicine, Engineering and Science of Texas study found drilling for oil and gas in shale rock pollutes the air, erodes soil and contaminates water, while the disposal of millions of gallons of wastewater causes earth-

quakes, the Houston Chronicle reported. The study also found that the shale oil boom has degraded natural resources, overwhelmed small communities and increased the frequency and severity of traffic collisions as workers rush to oil fields with their equipment.

Dallas newsstand operator faces prison for \$16M fraud

DALLAS — Officials say a Texas businessman faces up to 10 years in prison for using his Dallas newsstand to cash more than \$16 million of fraudulent government checks.

Prosecutors on Monday announced Moiz Muntaz Ali of McKinney pleaded guilty to failure to develop, implement and maintain an anti-money laundering program.

Ali in April was indicted on charges also including conspiracy, bank fraud, theft of public money and identity theft. Those counts will be dropped in the plea deal.

Records show Ali managed the Gateway Newsstand, which included a convenience and check-cashing store.

Investigators say Ali, from late 2010 through mid-2012, negotiated and cashed more than 3,400 U.S. Treasury checks. Prosecutors say most of the checks, addressed to people outside Texas, were obtained through fraudulent tax returns or the checks were stolen.



Man freed by N. Korea dies

CINCINNATI (AP) — Otto Warmbier, an American college student who was released by North Korea in a coma last week, died Monday, his family said.

The 22-year-old "has completed his journey home," relatives said in a statement. They did not cite a specific cause of death.

"Unfortunately, the awful, torturous mistreatment our son received at the hands of the North Koreans ensured that no other outcome was possible beyond the sad one we experienced today," his parents said.

Doctors had described his condition as a state of "unresponsive wakefulness" and said he suffered a "severe neurological injury" of unknown cause.

His father, Fred Warmbier, said last week that he believed Otto had been fighting for months to stay alive to return to his family.

Their statement Monday said he looked uncomfortable and anguished after arriving June 13, but his countenance later changed.

"He was peace. He was home, and we believe he could sense that," they said.

Tensions high after plane downed

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. shoots down a Syrian fighter jet for the first time. Syria attacks America's allies against Islamic State militants. Iran fires missiles into Syria. Russia threatens to target U.S. coalition planes.

As Syria's complex war ramps up, the Trump administration is scrambling to tamp down tensions and avoid open hostilities with the Russians.

This weekend's fast-paced developments bring new urgency to easing escalating strains between Washington and Moscow, who are both fighting in Syria but with opposing objectives.

It's an effort made more complicated by the increasingly messy battlefield in the Arab country, which includes deepening Iranian involvement — its first missile fire into Syria occurred Sunday — and an ongoing probe in the United States into Russian meddling in the presidential election.

In the first high-level U.S. public comments, Marine Gen. Joseph Dunford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, said Monday the former Cold War foes are in delicate discussions to restore normalcy to communications and maintain focus on fighting IS instead of each other.

Trademarks law struck down

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court on Monday struck down part of a law that bans offensive trademarks, ruling in favor of an Asian-American rock band called the Slants and giving a major boost to the Washington Redskins in their separate legal fight over the team name.

The justices were unanimous in saying that the 71-year-old trademark law barring disparaging terms infringes free speech rights guaranteed in the Constitution's First Amendment.

"It offends a bedrock First Amendment principle: Speech may not be banned on the ground that it expresses ideas that offend," Justice Samuel Alito said in his opinion for the court.

Slants founder Simon Tam tried to trademark the band name in 2011, but the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office denied the request on the ground that it disparages Asians.

Top court to hear redistricting case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court will take up a momentous fight over parties manipulating electoral districts to gain partisan advantage in a case that could affect the balance of power between Democrats and Republicans across the United States.

At issue is whether Republican lawmakers in Wisconsin drew legislative districts that favored their party and were so out of whack with the state's political breakdown that they violated the constitutional rights of Democratic voters. It will be the high court's first case in more than a decade on what's known as partisan gerrymandering.

Today's Highlight in History: On June 20, 1967, boxer Muhammad Ali was convicted in Houston of violating Selective Service laws by refusing to be drafted and was sentenced to five years in prison.

Today's Highlight in History: In 1782, Congress approved the Great Seal of the United States, featuring the emblem of the bald eagle. In 1791, King Louis XVI of France and his family attempted to flee in the so-called "Flight to Varennes," but were caught.

In 1863, a jury in New Bedford, Massachusetts, found Lizzy Borden not guilty of the ax murders of her father and stepmother. In 1921, U.S. Rep. Alice Mary Robertson, R-Okla., became the first woman to preside over a session of the House of Representatives.

In 1947, President Harry S. Truman vetoed the Taft-Hartley Act, which was designed to restrict the power of labor unions, but had his veto overridden by Congress. Gangster Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel was shot dead at the Beverly Hills, California, home of his girlfriend, Virginia Hill, apparently at the order of mob associates.

In 1968, the Beatles album "Yesterday and Today" records, initially with its notorious "butcher" cover photo which ended up being replaced. In 1977, the first oil began flowing through the recently completed Trans-Alaska Pipeline from Prudhoe Bay to Valdez (val-DEEZ).

In 1988, the U.S. Supreme Court unanimously upheld a New York City law making it illegal for private clubs with more than 400 members to exclude women and minorities. In 1990, South African black nationalist Nelson Mandela and his wife, Winnie, arrived in New York City for a ticker-tape parade in their honor as they began an eight-city U.S. tour.

In 2001, Houston resident Andrea Yates drowned her five children in the family bathtub, then called police. Yates was later found guilty of murder, but had her conviction overturned; she was acquitted by reason of insanity in a retrial.)

Ten years ago: For the second time, President George W. Bush vetoed an anti-youth stem cell bill as he urged scientists toward what he termed "ethically responsible" research. Sammy Sosa, playing for the Texas Rangers after a year out of baseball, hit his 600th home run, making him the fifth player to reach the milestone, the round-tripper came in the fifth inning of Texas' 7-3 victory over Sosa's former team, the Chicago Cubs.

Five years ago: A Republican-controlled House committee voted along party lines, 23-17, to hold Attorney General Eric Holder in contempt of Congress for failing to turn over Justice Department documents related to Operation Fast and Furious. (The full House voted in favor of the contempt citation eight days later.)

This proposed project greatly changes the outlook of my property and changes the use, accessibility, function, development attractiveness, and most important the VALUE.





## Projects Currently under Construction in Angelina County

- **US 59 (east loop in Lufkin)** – This project includes bridge maintenance and safety work, consisting of improving guardrail to design standards and upgrading bridge and approach railings at various locations along the east loop in Lufkin and other locations within the city. The project started May 15, 2017, and was awarded to SJ & J Construction in the amount of \$1,891,195.25. It is anticipated to be complete in the Fall of 2017.
- **US 59 Hot mix asphalt (HMA) Level-up, one course surface treatment (OCST) and porous friction course asphalt (PFC) Surface** – This project involves removing the top layer of existing pavement on US 59 from Redland to the Angelina River bridge. Then the road is resurfaced with HMA level-up, an OCST, and finished with a PFC. The project started June 5, 2017, and was awarded to Moore Brothers Construction in the amount of \$2,865,623.76. It is anticipated to be complete in the Fall of 2017.

"We're not worried too much about it because it's increased the value of our property," said John Conlon.

TxDOT said the project developments will also provide an efficient hurricane evacuation route.

In addition, the reconstruction will provide a system to connect to the future 1-69 corridor.

TxDOT is accepting comments until July 12.
