



**Notice of Public Meeting**  
**HACHAR-REUTHINGER HIGHWAY**  
**From FM 1472 (Mines Rd.) to I-35 Frontage Road**  
**CSJ's: 0922-33-165 and 0922-33-166**  
**Webb County, Texas**

The City of Laredo and Webb County are proposing to construct the new Hachar-Reuthinger Highway from FM 1472 (Mines Road) to the southbound western frontage road of Interstate 35 in Webb County, Texas. A public meeting on the proposed project is scheduled for July 9, 2019 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Barbara Fasken Community Center at 15201 Cerralvo Drive, Laredo, TX 78045. The meeting will be an open-house format; there will be no formal presentation. Spanish speaking personnel will be available. Plans and schematic drawings will be available for viewing starting at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of this public meeting is to present the planned improvements and to receive public comments on the proposed project.

The proposed Hachar-Reuthinger Highway (CSJ's 0922-33-165 and -166) will extend approximately 8.4 miles from FM 1472 (Mines Road) northbound lane east to the southbound (western) frontage road of Interstate 35 approximately 2 miles north of Beltway Parkway/Uniroyal Drive overpass. The initial phase of the project from FM 1472 to Beltway Parkway (Phase-1) will consist of a frontage road with two 12-foot lanes with a 4-foot inside and 10-foot outside shoulder in each direction, typically separated by approximately a 180-foot grassy median. Phase-2 will continue the same configuration from Beltway Parkway to the I-35 Frontage Road. An ultimate future phase will be developed as a full controlled-access freeway and will consist of three 12-foot main lanes with 10-foot inside and outside shoulders in each direction, separated by concrete barrier, three proposed overpasses and the original at-grade frontage roads. The proposed highway will be constructed on new location, a portion of which is located within the City of Laredo (Phase-1) and a portion of which (Phase-2) is located within Webb County limits.

The project will require between 400 to 500-feet of new Right-of-Way along its entire length consisting of approximately 480 acres to be donated. Although additional right-of-way is required, no residential or non-residential structures would be displaced. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners and information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition may be obtained from the district office at the address listed below.

The proposed facility will cross 100-year floodplains of Cuervo and Sombrerito Creeks. No impacts on wetlands, sole-source aquifers, or properties identified by Section 4(f) of the U.S Department of Transportation Act or Chapter 26 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code are anticipated. Impacts on other environmental resources are currently under study and will be documented in an Environmental Assessment.
