



I-410 / US 281 / SAN PEDRO AVENUE INTERCHANGE STUDY

Fact Sheet: Open House #2 - October 2017

About the Feasibility Study:

TxDOT is conducting a feasibility study to identify potential improvements in the vicinity of the Interstate 410 (I-410)/ US 281/San Pedro Avenue Interchange. The study area is within a corridor that ranks among the most congested roadways in Texas. The primary goal for TxDOT is improving traffic flow on I-410 and US 281. Study limits for each roadway are as follows:

- I-410 - Honeysuckle Ln. to Nacogdoches Rd.
- US 281 - Nakoma Dr. to Jones Maltsberger Rd. (South)
- San Pedro Ave. - US 281 to Rector St.

Recap of Open House #1:


Open House #1 was held on December 8, 2016 from 5:30 to 7:30 pm at the Castle Hills City Hall to introduce the study to the public. Information about the study area was shared by the study team and feedback was gathered from the public. A total of 76 people attended Open House #1.

What we Heard from You at Open House #1:

The study team received 15 written/verbal comments and over 120 notes/dots on the interactive exhibits at Open House #1. Most comments (63 percent) expressed concerns about traffic operations, such as merging and weaving, bottlenecks, ramps that go from 2 to 1 lane, exit/entrance ramps on I-410, and/or signal timing and queueing. Other comments recommended that multimodal facilities be provided for transit, bicycles and pedestrians. Safety issues caused by unpredictable traffic congestion in the study area was noted as another concern for travelers and pedestrians. Other comments expressed concern about the environment, connections to the community, aesthetics/placemaking and cost.


- Review the transportation concerns and needs identified through research/analysis, agency coordination, and stakeholder/public engagement
