BACKGROUND

We know you've got to get where you need to go. As our cranes

and trucks move into this stretch of I-35, we're committed to being a good neighbor to nearby property owners and drivers. We understand it can be tough on everyone when construction starts, which is why we're doing everything we can to minimize impacts and keep you informed. Commuters, businesses and residents can expect to see and hear a variety of construction activities on their travels through the I-35 corridor from Stassney Lane to William Cannon Drive.



WHAT TO EXPECT

OFTEN: Daily or weekly



Noise: Construction work is unavoidably noisy. Expect us to schedule the loudest work at times that are least impactful to neighbors and use noise limiting techniques like ambient backup alarms during night work.



Lights: Construction lighting is needed during night work for crews to perform their job. These lights will be directed away from nearby properties and highway traffic.



Heavy machinery: Expect to see big machines like cranes and forklifts in use during construction.



Lane shifts and closures: Lane closures are needed to safely complete our work. Directional signage will be provided.

RARELY: Several times a month or less



Vibration: Activities like drilling, concrete hammering, and excavation may cause vibration. Activities causing vibration will be monitored to ensure it is at safe levels.



Dust: Construction is dusty, however we will strive to keep our dirt at a minimum by using onsite sweepers and water trucks.



Ramp closures: Several short-term ramp closures will be needed throughout the project. Drivers will be notified prior to closures.



Property access impacts: A few properties may experience temporary property access modifications to allow crews to safely pave and modify frontage roads.
