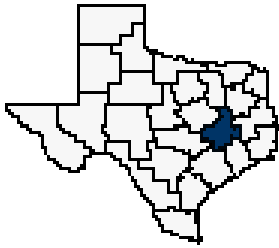




DISTRICT PROFILE

We have 1120 On-System bridges and 643 off-system bridges. For a total of 1863 Bridges.

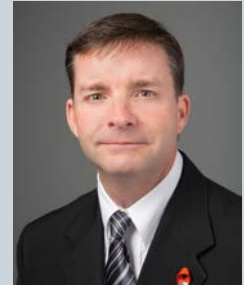
KEY PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

 - \$250 million
- SH 249 Extension in Grimes Co.
 - \$200 million
 - Design build project
- FM 2818 Widening in College Station
 - \$50 million
