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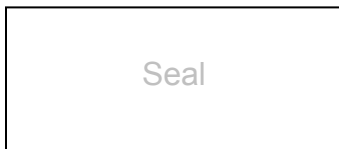

1. Attach a \$100.00 **nonrefundable** fee in the form of check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the State Highway Fund. Note that a permit application submitted for a sign relocated due to displacement of a highway project does not require a permit application fee. 43 TAC §21.444 and §21.435 (b)
2. If this application is **approved**, the applicant agrees to abide by the provisions of Texas Laws and the rules and regulations established by the Texas Transportation Commission pertaining to outdoor advertising and certify that the sign described below is erected and maintained in accordance with all specifications, standards and requirements under these laws, rules and regulations.
3. By issuance of a permit, TxDOT does not represent that the sign or location thereof meets city, county and/or local government laws, orders, ordinances and/or other regulations. By issuance of a permit, a contract or property right is not created in the permit of the license holder. 43 TAC §21.445
