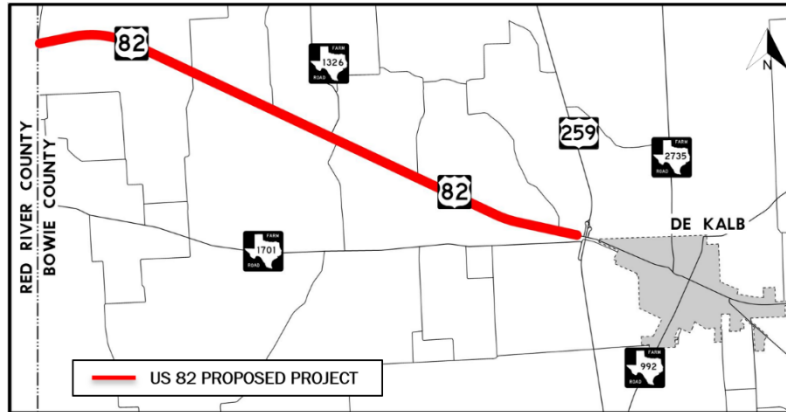




US 82 West Virtual Public Meeting

To combat the spread of COVID-19, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will be conducting a virtual public meeting to present proposed improvements to US 82 from the Red River County Line to 0.1 miles west of US 259 near De Kalb, Bowie County, Texas. The purpose of this virtual public meeting is to receive comments on the proposed project.

The US 82 West Virtual Public Meeting will be conducted in English. As part of this project, TxDOT is considering a Section 4(f) de minimis impact determination for impacts to the Northeast Texas Trail. The proposed widening of US 82 would require the relocation of this section of trail approximately 25 feet to the south of its current location. This section of trail would also be temporarily closed during construction. A Section 4(f) de minimis finding means that the proposed project would not adversely affect the activities, features, or attributes that qualify the Northeast Texas Trail for protection under Section 4(f). Bowie County and TxDOT will consider comments received during the environmental process before making a final Section 4(f) de minimis determination.
