FM 2154 (Wellborn Road) Widening
From SH 40 (William D. Fitch Parkway) to Greens Prairie Road

Brazos County, Texas

The Texas Department of Transportation in collaboration with the City of College Station and the Bryan/College Station Metropolitan Planning Organization (BCS MPO) is proposing improvements to FM 2154 (Wellborn Road) from SH 40 (William D. Fitch Parkway) to Greens Prairie Road in Brazos County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting a public hearing on the proposed project.

The hearing will be held on **Thursday, November 21, 2024, from 5:00 to 7:30 p.m. at Wellborn Middle School located at 15510 Royder Road, College Station, TX 77845.** Attendees will be able to come and go as they please to review project displays and ask questions of TxDOT staff in an open house format prior to a formal hearing presentation, which begins at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of the hearing is to present the proposed project and receive public comment. On the day of the hearing, the information presented will be made available online on the TxDOT website www.txdot.gov, keyword search "FM 2154 Widening".

The proposed project would widen FM 2154 from the existing two-lane roadway with a center turn lane to a four-lane roadway, two lanes in each direction separated by a raised median with dedicated left turn lanes at selected intersections. Additional improvements include a traffic signal at the intersection with McCullough Road, curb and gutter, and a shared-use path along the east side of the roadway. The proposed project is approximately 2.7 miles long.

The proposed project would, subject to final design considerations, require approximately 7.4 acres of additional right of way and potentially displace one residence and three non-residential structures. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling (979) 778-9607.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are on file and available for inspection by appointment Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the TxDOT Bryan District Office, 2591 North Earl Rudder Freeway, Bryan, TX 77803, (979) 778-2165. This information will also be available at the meeting. This information will also be available for review at the hearing.



The public hearing will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. Verbal and written comments from the public regarding the proposed project are requested and may be presented at the hearing. Written comments may also be submitted by mail to the TxDOT Bryan District Office, Attn: E. Sydney Fox, 2591 North Earl Rudder Freeway, Bryan, Texas 77803 or by email to BRY_PublicComment@txdot.gov. All comments must be received on or before Friday, December 6, 2024, to be included as part of the official public hearing record. Responses to comments received will be on file and available for inspection by appointment at the TxDOT Bryan District Office once they have been prepared.
