FM 3083: From SH 105 to I-45

Montgomery County, Texas**

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is the lead agency proposing to widen Farm-to-Market (FM) 3083 from State Highway (SH) 105 to Interstate Highway 45 (I-45) in Montgomery County, Texas. The total distance of the project is approximately 2.2 miles. Pursuant to Texas Administrative Code, Title 43, §2.106 and §2.108, this notice advises the public that draft environmental documents are available for public review and that TxDOT is affording an opportunity for a public hearing on the proposed project. The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by TxDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated December 16, 2014, and executed by FHWA and TxDOT.

The existing facility consists of a two-lane undivided roadway with open ditches. The proposed project would create a four-lane divided roadway with open ditches to convey stormwater between SH 105 and I-45. Five-foot wide sidewalks would be constructed on both sides of the roadway. The purpose of the proposed project is to facilitate mobility in central Montgomery County for the traveling public. The existing FM 3083 right-of-way (ROW) width varies within the project limits, but typically ranges from 180 to 230 feet. No additional ROW would be required to construct the new roadway. The proposed improvements would potentially require approximately 8.0 acres of new ROW for the addition of three detention basins. Although additional ROW is required, no residential or non-residential structures would be displaced. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners and information about the tentative schedule for ROW acquisition may be obtained from the district office at the address listed below.

Nine waters of the U.S. (approximately 1.11 acres), including four wetlands (approximately 0.48 acre) were identified within the project limits. All unavoidable impacts to jurisdictional waters of the U.S., including wetlands, would require a Section 404 Permit with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Galveston District. Portions of the proposed project occur within the floodplains of White Oak Creek and an unnamed tributary to White Oak Creek. TxDOT will coordinate the project with the local floodplain administrator.

The technical reports, exhibits showing schematic plans for the proposed project corridor, tentative schedule for ROW acquisition, and other information relative to the project are on file and available for inspection Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at the TxDOT Houston District Office, 7600 Washington Avenue, Houston, Texas 77007.
