

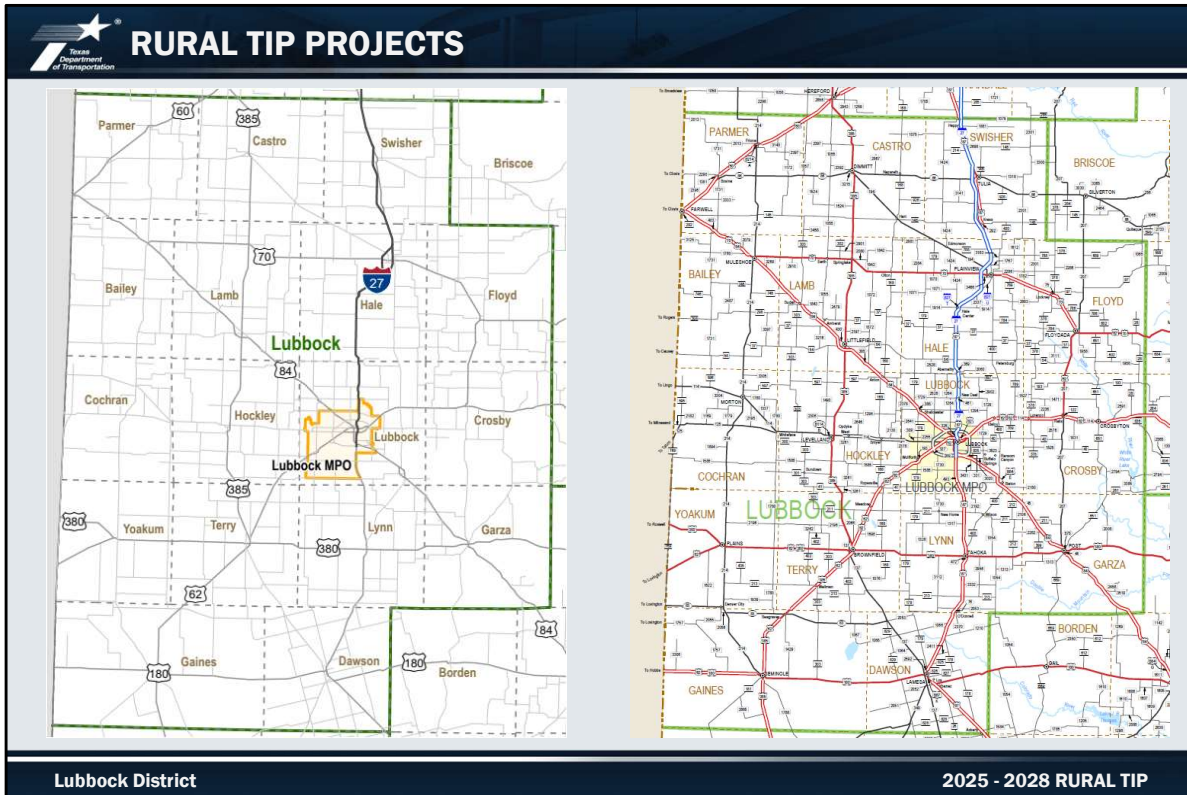


TXDOT RURAL TIP

Welcome!

Welcome to the Lubbock District's 2025-2028 Rural Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Virtual Public Meeting. This is a Pre-Recorded Video Presentation! My name is Kristi Schwartz and I am the Planner for the Lubbock District. We are here today to go over the projects to be included in the upcoming 2025-2028 Rural TIP.



The Lubbock District includes 17 counties, they are displayed on the map to the left of the screen. Starting at the top left corner: Parmer, Castro, Swisher, Bailey, Lamb, Hale, Floyd, Cochran, Hockley, Lubbock, Crosby, Yoakum, Terry, Lynn, Garza, Gaines, and Dawson counties.

We will review the basics of **what the Rural TIP is**, and **why is it important** for you to be here today. We will explain **how projects are** identified by evaluating existing and future needs. You will have the opportunity to review projects the Lubbock District has included in the 2025-2028 Rural TIP. This includes both large and small supporting projects, as well as funding.

Lastly, we will outline all the options you have to comment on these projects and their priority.

Projects included in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-2028 Rural TIP are located within the counties mentioned above.

THE RURAL TIP

WHAT IS IT?
 The Rural TIP is a list of all added capacity and regionally significant projects to be funded within a TxDOT District during the next four years, including those eligible for federal funding.
 It is multimodal:

 These are projects everyone uses!

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?
 Transportation projects CANNOT receive federal funding unless they are in the Rural TIP.
 Helps identify fund-matching requirements for state and local governments.
 Tell us your priorities.
 You know your community best!

HOW IS IT CREATED?
 Projects are identified by evaluating existing and future needs
Project identification considers current conditions and projections, statewide and regional plans as well as, public input regarding transportation priorities.
 Identified projects are classified as:
Regionally Significant Projects
Those with the appropriate scale or reach to be considered as stand-alone projects in a program year, have their own category.
Grouped Projects
Those without the scale to stand on their own are grouped into one of 12 categories and are considered as a single line item in the list.
 Projects respond to local needs!

WHO PAYS FOR IT?
 Funds to pay for all selected projects can come from 3 sources:
Federal Government
Through the Federal Highway and Transit Administrations
TxDOT
Through its Unified Transportation Program funding categories
Local Governments
Who may be required to provide matching funds for federal monies
 Funds come from all government levels

WHAT Is It?

The Rural Transportation Improvement Program is a list of projects to be funded over the next 4 years. This means that these projects are expected to go to construction soon! It is multimodal; which means that it can include projects relating to highways, bicycle and pedestrian facilities, transit services, and freight projects as well as the preliminary studies used to define those projects.

WHY Is It Important?

The Rural TIP is a part of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The program is established by Federal law, meaning no project can receive federal funding unless it is listed in the Rural TIP! It is important for you to participate because this process is intended to address your communities' most immediate needs. By reviewing the program, you are having a regional impact, helping us be more effective with your money, and ensuring that we are investing where we should.

HOW Is It Created?

Rural Transportation Organizations, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, and local governments are responsible for submitting projects within their boundaries. TxDOT is responsible for selecting projects relating to the State Transportation System and National roadways. Such as, the Interstate, State and US Highways, Farm-to-Market and Ranch-to-Market, Loops and Spurs. The roads you use every day. Once projects have been identified by evaluating existing and future needs, they are classified according to the funding they require as well as their potential impact. Large projects are categorized as Regionally Significant Projects and are stand-alone projects that have their own funding category. Smaller projects are those without the scale to stand on their own and are grouped into one of 12 categories, referred to as Grouped Projects. For example, landscaping, safety lights, new bicycle and pedestrian facilities, seal coats, and pavement repair of a roadway.

WHO Pays For It?

The Rural TIP functions as a "budget" for the District. Like a budget of a household, the Rural TIP must be realistic about the amount of money available and stay fiscally constrained. Funds can come from 3 main sources:

- 1) Federal Government- they allocate funds through the process established by the Federal Highway and Transit Administration.
- 2) TxDOT-like the Federal Government, allocates a section of the budget through the Unified Transportation Program funding categories.
- 3) Local Government-who could be required to provide matching funds for federal monies. They are also expected to be consistent with projects and objectives included in the regional Long Range Transportation Plans, to ensure that all agencies are working towards the same goal.

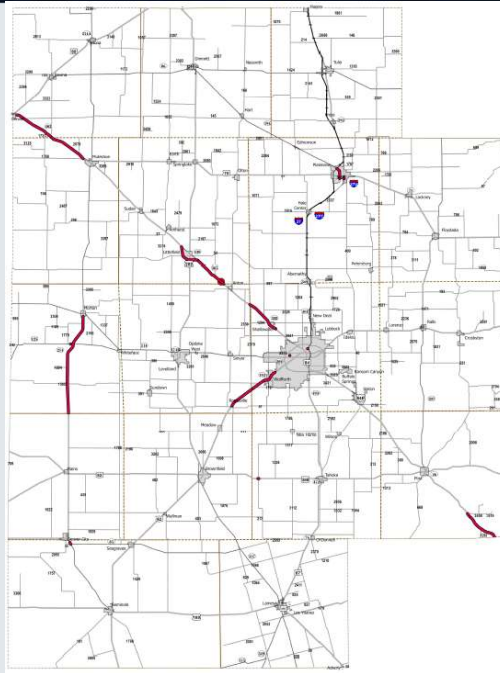

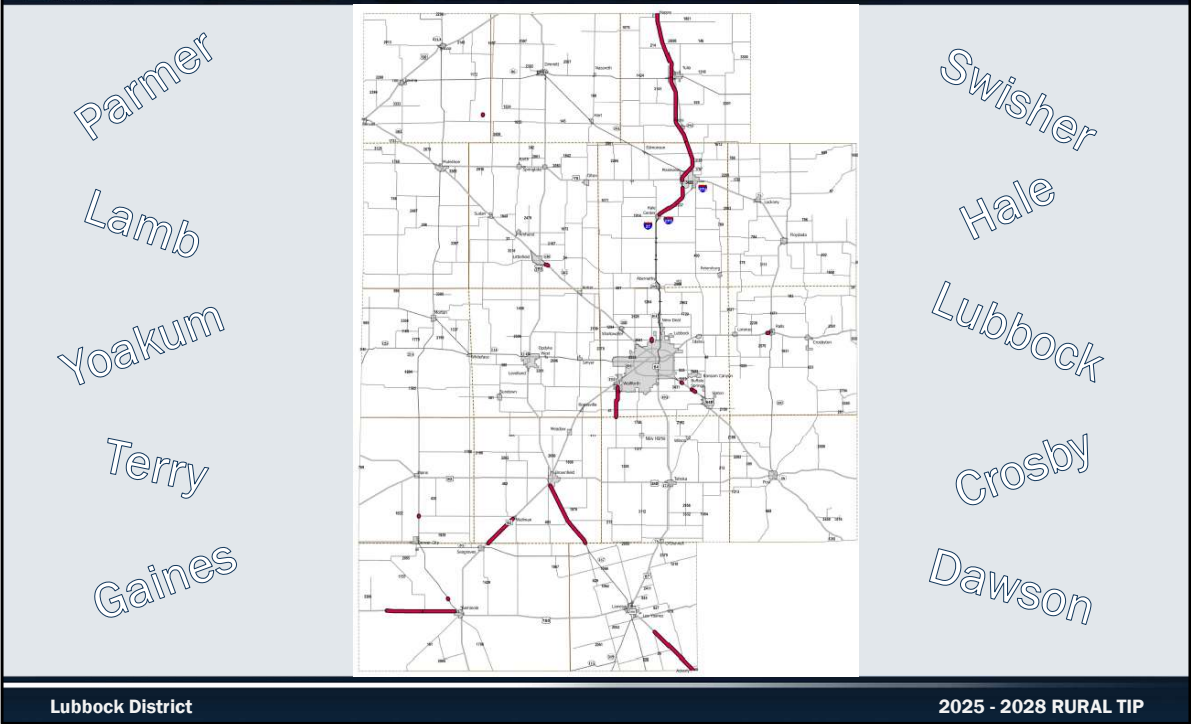

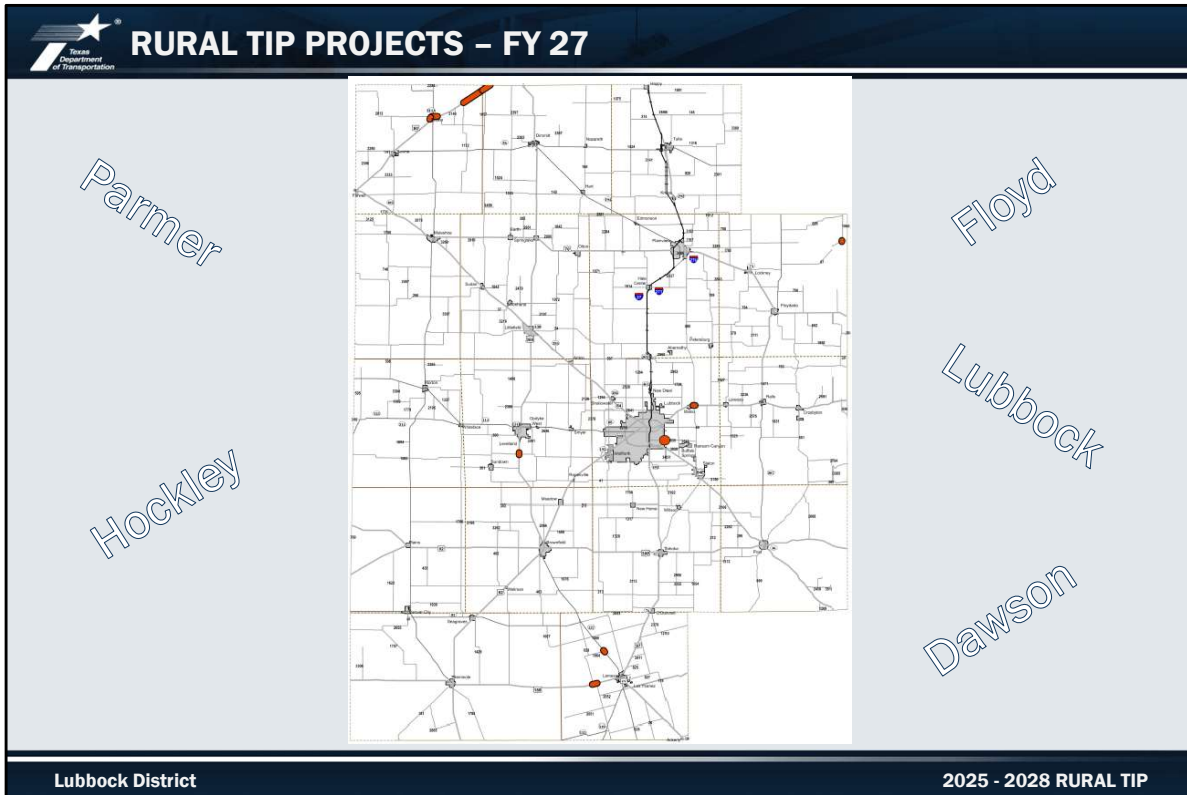

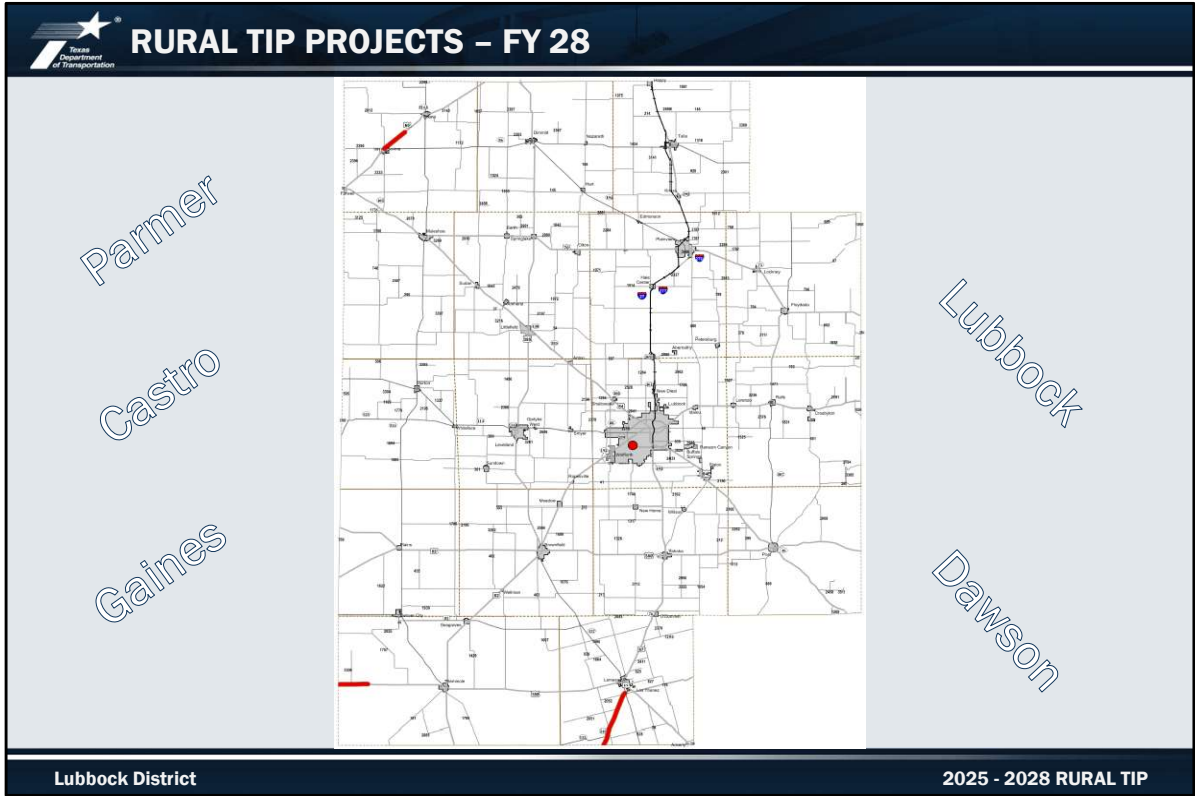

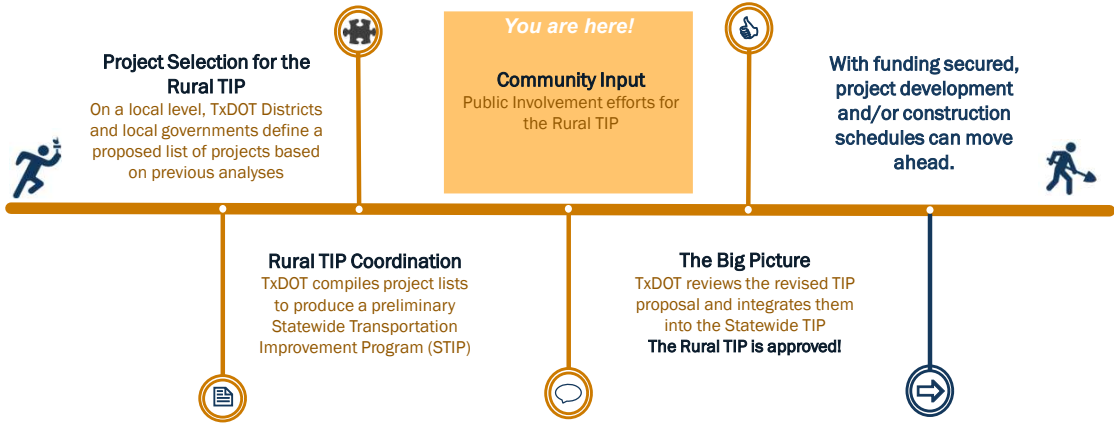

In the Rural TIP Process



The timeline above illustrates the Rural TIP process and where we are right now. We have completed the project selection. I have compiled the projects and displayed them for your review. Now it is time for the community’s input. Once your comments have been collected and considered, if necessary, the Lubbock District will provide TxDOT with a revised Rural TIP for approval and integration into the Statewide document.

The Statewide TIP, is built from 25 Districts Rural TIP as well as the Transportation programs from all the MPOs. The timeline above shows where in the Rural TIP process, we fit into this larger effort. Once the STIP is approved by the Federal government, everyone’s projects are funded, and are one step closer to getting on the ground.
