I-410 AT US 281/SAN PEDRO AVENUE OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS
I-410 from West Avenue to Broadway Street - US 281 from I-410 to E. Nakoma Drive -
San Pedro Avenue at I-410

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is proposing to improve Interstate Highway 410 (I-410) from West Ave. to Broadway St. along with improvements on US 281 from I-410 to E. Nakoma Dr. and at the intersection of San Pedro Ave. and I-410 in Bexar County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting an online virtual public meeting on the proposed project. The virtual public meeting will begin on Tuesday, Oct. 13, 2020 CST at 5 p.m. and will be open for comment until Wednesday, Oct. 28, 2020. To log on to the virtual public meeting, go to the following web address at the date and time indicated above: www.txdot.gov, keyword search "I-410 at US 281" in the upper right-hand search box. Project staff will provide a pre-recorded presentation with audio and visual components. The meeting will also include schematics of the proposed improvements, video simulations, and opportunities to comment. If you do not have internet access, you may call (210) 615-5839 between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to ask questions about the project and access project materials during the project development process. Formal comments may be provided by mail or email as explained below.

The proposed improvements, as explained below, are at various locations along I-410, US 281, and San Pedro Ave. at I-410 in the cities of San Antonio and Castle Hills, Texas.

I-410 Proposed Improvements

The proposed improvements to I-410 from West Ave. to Broadway St. would include changing ramp locations and alignments; constructing auxiliary lanes and concrete median barriers; widening and realigning frontage roads; improving intersections; and restriping roadways. I-410 would retain four to six mainlanes with two- to four-lane frontage roads as well as intermittent, non-continuous auxiliary lanes. Direct connectors and ramps would still provide access to major intersecting roads. The proposed improvements would also include modifications at the Northwest Military Hwy. interchange.

US 281 Proposed Improvements

The proposed improvements to US 281 from I-410 to E. Nakoma Dr. would include changing ramp locations and alignments; adding auxiliary lanes; restriping roadways; and constructing a southbound collector-distributor. US 281 would generally consist of three to four mainlanes as well as intermittent, non-continuous auxiliary lanes, with a one- to two-lane frontage roads. The proposed improvements also include reconstruction of the Rhapsody Dr. bridge over the existing southbound US 281 mainlanes and the proposed southbound collector-distributor.

San Pedro Ave. at I-410 Proposed Improvements

The proposed improvements to San Pedro Ave. at I-410 would include improving intersections, constructing turn lanes, and restriping roadways. San Pedro Ave. would generally continue to retain three lanes in each direction with new additional turn lanes.

Although additional right-of-way would be required, no residential or commercial business displacements are anticipated at this time. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners and information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling (210) 615-5839.

Portions of the proposed project would involve an action in a floodplain. The project is subject to and will comply with federal Executive Order 11988 on Floodplain Management.

Maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative project schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are available online at www.txdot.gov, keyword search "I-410 at US 281" in the upper right-hand search box to access these materials in the virtual public meeting.

The virtual public meeting will be available in English and Spanish. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating effectively in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs.
