## LEGAL NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

---

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will hold a public meeting on Tuesday, June 25, 2019, to present proposed roadway improvements for FM 756 in Smith County. The meeting will be held from 5-7 p.m. at Shiloh Road Church of Christ gymnasium located at 1801 Shiloh Road, Tyler, TX 75703. The meeting will be an open house, “come-and-go” format without a formal presentation. Representatives from TxDOT and its consultants will be available to answer individual questions.

The purpose of the meeting is to gather public input on the recommended alternative. The projects’ limits are from Jeff Davis Drive, south to FM 344 in Bullard. The proposed work includes widening the existing two-lane facility to four lanes with a flush median. The project will require new right-of-way from adjacent property owners.

All interested parties are invited to attend this meeting, gather information, and provide feedback. Persons with special communication or accommodation needs, including language interpretation, should contact TxDOT at (903) 510-9100 at least two working days prior to the meeting. Every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate those needs.

Written comments related to the proposed project may be submitted at the meeting or mailed to Texas Department of Transportation, Advanced Project Development Office, 2709 W. Front Street, Tyler, Texas, 75702. Comments may also be emailed to [carson.hollis@txdot.gov](mailto:carson.hollis@txdot.gov). To be included as part of the project’s official record, comments must be received by Thursday, July 11, 2019.
